A Life of Learning and Love....

"More Than Enough"

This year's stewardship commission chose the theme "More Than Enough" for our annual pledge campaign. It is based on 2 Corinthians 9. The early Christians in Macedonia were living in poverty, and yet they took a generous collection to support their brothers and sisters in Christ. In a few short yet deep verses Paul writes: "the one who sows sparingly will reap sparingly... God loves a cheerful giver... And God is able to provide you with EVERY Blessing IN ABUNDANCE, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work."

As Thanksgiving draws near, I invite you to count your blessings. Literally. Sit down with a piece of paper or a page in your journal or diary and begin to write down a list of EVERY blessing you can name. Here's part of my list: fresh Wyoming air, shelter in a snowstorm, the gift of my family (both near and far), my latest meal, my next meal, unconditional love (from God and from our dog Henry), clean water, meaningful work, talents to share, a friend who listened to me, a cup of hot cocoa, health, patience when I really needed it, a good book, The Good Book, hearing a new song, singing a new song, new friends, a helpful neighbor, enough money to pay the mortgage, thoughtful conversation, seeing the world with new eyes.... Be specific in your list. Include names and dates and details. Give thanks for big things and little things and things that aren't "things" at all.

This simple practice of naming ALL the blessings we receive can help us realize that we are loved by a God of ABUNDANCE. Nearly every member in our congregation has enough - there will be food on the table and a bed to sleep in. In fact, nearly every one of us, whether we know it or not, actually has more than enough. Like the Macedonians who knew tight times and hunger, may we be blessed with generous hearts.

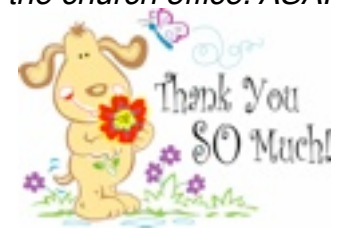
