### "Pumpkin Ponderings"



It's happening once again... the annual miracle we call "The Pumpkin Patch." As I stood passing pumpkins Sunday afternoon, I marveled again at how many hands it takes to run the patch. There is no way that just one or two people could unload all those pumpkins! (Our first load this year was 22 tons. The second weighed in at about 16 tons. That's a lot of orange squash!) And it's not just the unloading that takes a lot of help. There are CWF'ers who faithfully bring home-baked goodies throughout the month, Cub Scouts manning the tent every Monday, storytellers to welcome school groups each day, and all of the volunteers who sell the pumpkins! (Not to mention both members of the church and our neighbors in Casper who purchase pumpkins and make donations for the mission work of the church.) To me, the Pumpkin Patch is a living parable of what the church is called to be - many hands working happily together to share laughter, love and light as we use our varied abilities to make a difference in the world in Christ's name.

After the second truck finally unloaded, I looked around our full Patch... there are pumpkins of every shape and size - some tall, some round, some tiny, some back-breakingly huge! There are green ones, white ones, bright yellowish-orange and deeper-red orange ones, smooth or bumpy, each seems to have its own happy personality. It's fun to watch families come to the Patch. I enjoy seeing little children pick out their very own pumpkin. Each pumpkin has the potential to be "THE" one - the "perfect" pumpkin that someone is looking for.... I spoke with a woman Sunday afternoon who was patiently waiting as we unloaded the truck. She was looking for "white ones" and explained to me that they're a "lumina" variety, smooth and white on the outside but bright orange inside with a creamy texture when baked.

I can't help but wonder if God looks at us rather like that lovely pumpkin patch. We're all different sizes, shapes and colors (some of us are bumpy while others are smooth). Yet to God - each one of us has the potential to become THE one, a perfectly loved child of the Most High God. See you in the Patch -

**COMMISSION UPDATES** - Each year, leading up to our Stewardship Campaign, we hear from every commission chair about the work of the various groups in the Church. Some of their reports are shared here:

How do you define “**Social Action**”? First Christian Church’s Social Action Commission defines it as reaching beyond the walls of this church into the Casper community with Christian love to those less fortunate, whether they are homeless, hungry or displaced.

Every other month, alternating with Christian Women’s Fellowship, a meal is served at the Central Wyoming Rescue Mission. Members of the Commission prepare and serve up to 60 men, women & children. Nine months a year cakes are delivered to our two Casper Youth homes. These Youth homes are also remembered on Halloween, Valentine’s Day & Easter. Many hours of volunteer service are reported by dedicated Commission members & we know there are many in our congregation who regularly volunteer at various non-profit organizations. Non-perishable goods donated by the congregation are delivered once a month to Joshua’s Storehouse. Donations of money are also welcomed at the local food banks, enabling them to purchase more food for the dollar through Food Bank of the Rockies. You, too, are reaching out with love. We urge church members to sign the volunteer hours sheet that will be placed on our church bulletin board & report your hours of service.

The Social Action Commission has a current annual budget of \$1950. Of this amount \$1200 is donated to the Interfaith Task Force, which is a non-denominational clearing house supplying needs for the disadvantaged. If a specific need from other organizations is known we try to meet it within our budget.

First Christian Church is a caring church. Your Tithes & offerings enable us to continue this vital ministry.

## Interfaith

Interfaith of Natrona County provides a wide variety of assistance to people in need in our community. Sometimes it may be a stranded traveler, a family caught in a bind, or someone temporarily unemployed who just needs a little help with rent or utilities to avoid losing their home. Their primary purpose is: "To prevent homelessness through provision of basic needs, emergency services and connection to community resources." They provide housing counseling and case management to promote self-sufficiency. As a central intake and referral center, they empower numerous churches and private agencies in town to pool our resources and thus have a greater impact on meeting urgent needs.

Our congregation was instrumental in the beginning of Interfaith, and we still have members who volunteer there. Thanks to the efforts of Church Women United, Casper clergy, social service agency directors and interested individuals, Interfaith began providing emergency assistance in 1984. During the past year, Interfaith helped 2,532 clients (which benefitted 5,494 family members) with housing, medical prescriptions, transportation, and employment documents.

Part of FCC's Social Action Commission budget includes giving \$100 per month to Interfaith. Your dollars make a difference! Both in the ministries we do on site and through our combined ecumenical efforts working with others, we are changing lives for the good. Wouldn't it be great if our pledges this fall increased enough that we could double or even triple our giving to Interfaith?

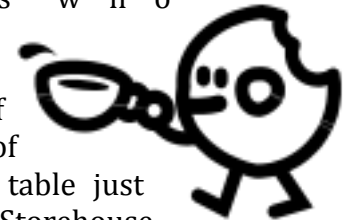
## Donut Sunday Returns
