### "The JOY of Giving"



Last weekend, I had the privilege of attending the CRMR Women's Renewal at the Glen Eyrie Retreat Center in Colorado Springs. It is a lovely setting, with beautifully landscaped grounds surrounded by the striking red rock formations of the "Garden of the Gods" area. 90 women from NM, WY, and CO attended. We were blessed with excellent sermons by both Jose Morales (our Transitional Regional Minsiter) and Pat Donahoo (the Executive Director for Disciples Women). Following the theme of God's Wonder-FULL World, we "visited" 7 continents as we shared in Bible study and conversations. You can be very proud of our congregation. It was a privilege for me to work on the planning team with our own Jenny Black and Jennifer Hawley, and our shared leadership was very well received by the women of the region.

Among other cultural traditions, we learned that in many African churches, the time of offering during worship is a wondrous celebration! The offering is "danced" forward with great joy, and, at times, more than one offering will be received. To share in this spirit during Renewal, the women danced up an offering of 50 fleece blankets that had been hand-tied to be given to the residents of the Tennyson Center for Children at the Colorado Christian Home.

Have you ever thought about what a privilege it is to be able to give? There is true JOY in knowing that we can help others by sharing of our time or talents or material resources. A tradition of giving among many Christian Women's Fellowship "CWF" (or Disciples Women's Ministry "DWM") members is the "blessing box." The idea is to keep a small box or container handy, and, when you feel blessed - to put a few coins in the box as an offering to say THANK YOU to God for the blessing you received. One year, while I was keeping a blessing box, I wrote a list of each blessing throughout the year... it included little things like hot chocolate and fall leaves, and bigger things like the joy of having an exchange student in our home. TO GIVE is both a way of thanking God when we are blessed and of being a blessing to others. May we live generously each day, becoming filled with such joy that we long to dance our offerings to God.

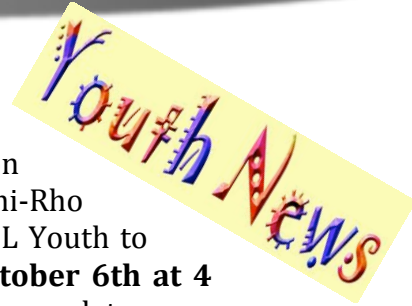
### Youth Group meetings
