
A Life of Learning and Love....

"Sharing our Stories"

When I shared with the congregation last summer that I planned an in-depth study of the Psalms during my sabbatical, I was surprised when one church member said, "I don't like the Psalms. I never have." I was thrilled when she followed that up by saying, "But I'm going to read them along with you." The Psalms are an amazing gallery of poetry that captures the highs and lows of our walk of faith. Some of the Psalms are angry, some drag us down to pits of despair, others lift our hearts to soaring heights of praise. In expressing all ranges of human emotion, they remind me that God is present with us whenever and wherever we find ourselves. Even in those darkest of moments when we can't feel the presence of God and cry out with the Psalmist "How long oh Lord?" - the sacred text bears testimony that others have walked this way before. We are part of an ongoing story through the generations of people who have known and sought after the Divine One. During worship in this season of Eastertide, between Easter and Pentecost, I am preaching from the Psalms and sharing some of the illustrated Psalter I began during sabbatical. This week after worship, at an all-church potluck, I'll be sharing photos of some of the places I travelled (and some of the churches I visited) last summer. I hope that you can attend.

On Saturday, a small group of us will travel to the Wind River Reservation to meet with Shoshone and Arapahoe members to hear stories about life on the Reservation. Life on "the Rez"

is hard. The high school dropout rate and teen/young adult suicide rate is twice as high on the Reservation as in the rest of our state. The overall per capita income of Native Americans is half of all other Americans. Every Reservation has examples of extreme poverty and high unemployment. The contributing factors are complex. We are not going with the intent to "solve" a "problem" for our neighbors, rather we are going willing to learn from them. We will share the story of faith by being a listening witness. We are taking gifts of books and blankets, but the most important gift to share is ourselves - as we listen with humble, open hearts to the stories of our Native neighbors. Like reading some of the Psalms, it may be hard - but we will no doubt glimpse God in the midst of this important "mission day." Pray for us all. - Pastor Cynthia



"MEMORIES OF HEART MOUNTAIN"

The Natrona County Historical Society, partnering with the Student Activities Board of Casper College and the Wyoming Humanities Council, is pleased to bring a free presentation to history students and enthusiasts of all ages. From 7 to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 6th come to the Durham Auditorium at Casper College's Aley Fine Arts Center to experience Sam Mihara's presentation. From 8:30 to 9 p.m. Sam will answer your questions.

Sam Mihara is a second generation Japanese American who was born and raised in San Francisco. When World War II broke out, the United States government forced Sam, at age 9, and his family to move to an internment camp, between Cody and Powell, Wyoming. This was the Heart Mountain Relocation Camp, where they lived for three years. Now, in retirement, Sam enjoys publicly speaking about what he and his family experienced during WW II. His program is informative and entertaining complete with power point and video accompaniments.
