For many of our members, being able to gaze upon the Good Shepherd stained glass window enhances worship. Being in the same space where others have worshiped for decades before can draw us closer to the Divine.

Each summer, our youth experience worship (as well as learning, games, meals, sleeping, playing & "family group" activities) at church camp in the Black Forest near Colorado Springs. Next Sunday, July 26th, we'll gather for Worship on the Mountain at the edge of Beartrap Meadow on Casper Mountain. This annual trek brings the opportunity to worship God our Creator under the beauty of pine trees as we feel our spirits soar.

As you read this, Charles and I will be worshiping with thousands of other Disciples of Christ at the General Assembly in Columbus, Ohio. A city convention center will be transformed into both meeting hall and sanctuary as Disciples from across the U.S. and Canada join to "be church" en masse.

Of course, "being church" is not just about worship - it's about everything we do together in Christ's name.... when elders take communion to a nursing home, when your pastor prays at a hospital bedside or officiates at a wedding or funeral, when our sandwich ministry volunteers feed the hungry in downtown Casper - we are being church in all kinds of places!

Wherever your travels take you this summer, I hope you'll have the opportunity to fellowship with other believers. If you're in a different town or city on a Sunday morning, seek out a place to worship and be open to the experience God will give you. #### Summer Lawn, Tree and Custodial Schedule

This summer we have hired GNT Services, a Glenrock based company, to mow and trim the lawns around the church. They come on Thursday mornings. They only tend the grass areas, so it is a blessing anytime volunteers step up to help spray or pull weeds or tend flowerbeds. Eventually the flowerbed right outside the front door of the church will be removed when foundation repair work is done along the sanctuary

east wall. Bear Bottom Tree Service is in the process of cutting down the dead and overgrown trees on the property line between NCHS and the church parking lot. They have also trimmed the evergreen shrubs in front of the church that suffered storm damage.

Our cleaning service is CJ Custodial. During the summer, the church and all the restrooms are scheduled to be cleaned on Friday nights (on a rare occasion they are cleaned on Saturdays instead). They do not come during the week in the summer, so be aware that if you think a bathroom or other room has not been cleaned, that it will be cleaned before Sunday morning. During the school year they clean on MWF evenings. They DO NOT set up or take down chairs/tables for activities, so if you have anything that requires chairs/tables, please make sure you contact someone to help with setting up what is needed. If you don't know who to ask for help with tables or chairs for a specific event, feel free to speak with either Pastor Cynthia or Kathy Winders to recruit needed helpers. Big thank you's to the CWF members for faithfully tidying up the downstairs kitchen, to our commissions who clean up after hosting Sunday coffees and other volunteers who help behind the scenes whenever needed.

Our custodial service is also scheduled to deep clean tile floors - stripping and waxing the Sunday school rooms during the summer. They do this at no added cost to the church.

Since we do not have a full time custodian on staff, it is very helpful for all of us to clean up after ourselves. The key to the dumpster is located on the bulletin board in the kitchen so you can empty bags from the garbage cans after a meal or other major event.

If there is a particular spot of the church building that you see which needs "deep cleaning" or an area on the grounds needing extra attention – you're welcome to adopt that as a personal project. You can speak with the Property Commission if you need guidance. If there is a location which you notice is being overlooked in the *basic* weekly custodial care, please bring that concern to Pastor Cynthia, Board Chair Keith Rouse or one of our "at large" board members (Jeremy Allen & Darlene Bishop). Our pastor and administrative secretary communicate regularly with the cleaning service. Because of the pay scale for this type of work, there is often turn-over, which means we may have a different individual cleaning the church from time to time. Different people naturally pay attention to different details. We appreciate your direct communication in helping us to use the cleaning service to the fullest potential, as well as everyone pitching in to care for "God's house."

We also have boxes of Kleenex in the pews in the sanctuary and ask that when you leave your pew that you check around to see if there is any used Kleenex, bulletins, candy wrappers etc., left in your pew, pick them up and throw in the garbage can as you leave the church. Let's institute the rule the Scouts practice: "leave no trace."

The Church is God's house. Our Property Commission works tirelessly on maintenance projects and hires people to do most of the dirty work, but it still requires all of us to work together to keep God's house looking nice.

Note: The West parking lot will be repaved within the next few weeks. Thank you to Tom Dowler, Cal Decker and Property for moving this much-needed project forward.


