A Life of Learning and Love....

"Christian Community"

I recently have had the privilege of multiple experiences of Christian community in ecumenical settings. On April 25, Disciples across our region shared in "mission day" experiences in various settings. Cindy Huckfeldt, Cindy White from Cheyenne and I travelled to the Wind River Reservation. We met Deacon Ted from the Indian Baptist Church as we delivered blankets, coats, and baskets of food to the church pantry. He told of a little boy who thanked him for a blanket, saying joyfully "This is the first time I've had a blanket of my very own!" and of grandmothers who would be *thrilled* to receive the fresh oranges we'd brought. Millie Friday who is Northern Arapahoe, Episcopalian and a member of the Native American Church, spoke of the powerful work she does with at risk teens, helping them to reclaim a sense of identity through learning tribal traditions that were oppressed in the era of boarding schools. Fred, who is Eastern Shoshone, gave us a tour of just part of the vast reservation - both explaining history of the land and sharing personal stories of his own family's heritage there. My favorite moment of the day was listening to him sing a prayer accompanied on a drum he'd made. It was humbling to hear the stories of "historical trauma" which still affect our brothers and sisters of Wind River. I pray this was just the first of many relationship building ventures.

On May 7th, I was in Alamogordo visiting my parents. My Dad sings with a local chorus, made of men from a dozen churches. They were performing at the National Day of Prayer luncheon, and it was a blessing of timing that I was there to sit with Mom while he sang and then listen to various preachers and civic leaders share in prayer, just as I knew Christians in Casper and around the nation were also praying.

May 11-15 I was in Denver, along with about 1800 other pastors from numerous denominations, for the national annual Festival of Homiletics. We heard powerful preaching from a variety of traditions, excellent lectures, thought provoking workshops and shared in fellowship - and, oh, the singing! I sat with Disciples of Christ clergy colleagues from northern Colorado, but also greeted friends from across the country. When I was on sabbatical last fall, I met Stephen Savides, pastor of a large UCC congregation in Wisconsin. Last summer, we were together at both Ghost Ranch and again in Racine, WI at a Dominican Retreat Center. Now, here he was again, walking across the room to greet me at a Presbyterian Church in Denver! We updated each other on prayer requests and the journeys of our lives. Each of these experiences was a chance to be "at table" with other believers. Though we worship in many ways and see God through our own particular cultural lenses, we belong to one another in Christ. Thank you, church, for the privilege of knowing and speaking of Jesus in your midst each week. *Pastor Cynthia*

THEOLOGY/FISHING RETREAT

Purpose: To bring men (clergy and laity) together for deeper theological conversation and to enjoy the pleasure of fishing. **Dates:** August 3-7, 2015. We begin Monday afternoon/evening with dinner around 5:30p.m. at Bear Lodge Resort. We conclude on Friday morning with light breakfast and short conversations. **Place:** Bear Lodge Resort, Bighorn Mountains, Northern Wyoming (www.bearlodgeresort.com) We do most of our fishing on the North and South Tongue Rivers. They are small rivers in comparison to trophy fishing on the Big Horn and Platte Rivers, but you catch fish and the scenery of Northern Wyoming at 8,000 feet is gorgeous.

Housing: Option 1: Motel at Bear Lodge. Average cost is \$80 a night plus taxes.

<u>Option 2:</u> Camping. Visit: www.recreation.gov go to Bighorn National Forest. Check availability of (1) Tongue River, (2) Prune Creek, Sibley Lake, and Owen Creek campgrounds. All are within five miles of Bear Lodge where we conduct our formal conversations. You can also camp in the National Forest as long as you are ½ mile off the highway which leaves you a lot of space! <u>Guest Leader:</u> Dr. Ron Degges, President of Disciples Home Mission for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Format: We try to keep a relaxed format for a retreat experience, with dialogue around theological topics. We usually have theological conversations in the morning and evening. We welcome both clergy and laity. Most guys come from the Disciples of Christ or United Church of Christ tradition. We fish from mid morning to late afternoon (around 4:30). In the catch and release areas, you can catch fish anywhere between 12 inches and 20 inches. In the keep fish zones, the fish are smaller, usually 8 inch to 12 inch. Some guys have caught up to forty fish in a day; other times, the fishing is more challenging and we only catch four or five. Regardless, we have a good time with good men. We have expert fishermen and novices. We have also had hikers and photographers too. Fishing is catch and release with artificial bait. Most are fly fishermen, or wannabe fly fishermen. The main thing is: We are having fun.

Fishing Gear: We assume you have your own fishing gear; however, in some cases, Pastor Doug and the members of FCC Sheridan can assist with borrowed gear. **Cost:** \$225.00. This cost covers the expenses of our guest leader and other expenses to operate the retreat. You pay for your lodging and food. Please make checks payable to First Christian Church (DOC) 102 South Connor; Sheridan, Wyoming 82801. Our insurance provider prefers we remind everyone that First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Sheridan is not responsible for accidents. We assume everyone has their own insurance. Fishing licenses are \$14.00 a day. We eat dinner every evening in the restaurant, so everyone can order what they like! Evening meal cost is between \$12-20 a night. BOY SCOUT TROOP #13 FUNDRAISER



The Mission Commission will be serving at the Central Wyoming Rescue Mission on Thursday, May 21st. We will also take two cakes to the Henry Home and the Youth Crisis Center as we do each month. Our mission trip participants (along with Cindy White from FCC Cheyenne) had the privilege of meeting with members of both the Arapahoe and Shoshone nations as well as Chesie Lee, the director of the Wyoming Association of Churches.

The Sandwich Ministry is serving 110 sack lunches each Saturday, and the people who receive them are very grateful. One of our recipients is an 89 year old Navy Veteran who said "Your church must be a very nice church to do this every week. Please tell the people there how much the meals mean to me." There is a thank you card from another recipient on the bulletin board. It is through your generous donations of time and resources that we are able to feed the homeless, poor, and hungry people in our community. Thank you for all that you do! We are so blessed to have so many caring people in our church and the community! The people who were donating our water every week are no longer able to do so. When that was announced we have had several people provide water. Thank you so much! Ben Goddard from Ridley's East sold us a pallet of water at cost minus their donation of \$50.00 for a total of \$84.00.
