#### Holiday: Holy - Days

Following the Road of Lifelong Faithfulness....

I recently cooked cranberries for supper. No, it wasn't Thanksgiving yet, and it wasn't necessarily a special supper. I fixed pork chops and rice, a lettuce salad, sliced some bakery bread and wanted just a little something more to go with the evening meal I was serving to Charles and Peder Bakken, our Norwegian exchange student "son." I had some cranberries in the freezer I'd been planning on fixing for Thanksgiving, but we've decided to take a little road trip, so I won't be cooking a turkey and all the trimmings this year. (I'm sure glad we'll have our Thanksgiving dinner at church this Sunday!) Peder has been eager to get to visit Denver, and about the only time we'll all have a few days off from work and school is for Thanksgiving.... so, off we'll go - not "over the river and through the woods" - but down I-25 for our Norwegian to see the Big City!

Our suppers together are the best time we have to talk with Peder about his experiences in America - how school's going, what friends he's spending time with, how excited he is for the football ball, and what feels different about America from Norway. Placing cranberries on the table gave us a chance to talk about holiday meals.... perhaps more than any other dinner, Thanksgiving is when your family traditions come out. My Mom always cooked whole cranberries with just enough sugar to sweeten them and boiling water so they'd pop open. Charles' Mom would open a can of smooth cranberry jelly and put it on a plate, leaving it in the shape of the can so they could slice along the rings. His grandmother would cook whole cranberries but mixed them with orange rind and other flavors. What family tradition do you have that makes Thanksgiving special?

For me, it certainly doesn't seem time for Thanksgiving already. That means that Advent is just around the corner... one of the most "holy" (and most busy) times of the year for our church family. On November 29th, we'll have a Hanging of the Greens service during morning worship, with a series of readings and songs celebrating the beginning of Advent as we decorate the sanctuary for the season. For many of us, this time of year also means we'll be decorating our

homes, making plans for parties and presents, exchanging cards, preparing special foods. It is easy to be overwhelmed by all the "trimmings" that come with the holiday season. In the midst of it all, I pray that you'll have time to be aware of God's presence with you EVERY day. Even mundane days are holy when we take time to notice God. The gift of a sunrise, the warmth of a hand to hold, shared laughter, a cup of tea with a friend, or the wagging tail of a puppy can speak to us of God's love if we pay attention.

In a way, I've started my holiday early - by cooking cranberries for supper on an ordinary night - and by intentionally reminding myself that ordinary days are holy too. The current season of the church year, the liturgical time of these months between Pentecost and Advent, is officially called "Ordinary Time." The term reminds us that God has "ordered" or numbered all of our days. Each and every day of our lives is a gift from God. *Every* day is holy. If you're already feeling some pre-holiday stress in thinking about everything you want to get done, take a deep breath. Trust that God has given you just the right amount of time for what is really most important. May your holiday be holy - and every day too!

#### PUMPKIN PATCH REPORT

Once again, thank you to all who helped with the Patch this year. It truly takes a village to make the Patch a success. Thank you to CWF for the wonderful chili supper that fed our army of volunteers on October 6th. CWF's baked goods are often the reason many folk stop by the patch. Thanks to the men and women who brought 4 wheelers and a tractor to set up pallets and unload the pumpkins. Thanks to Dennis Baker for coordinating the addition of a fork lift this year to help with unloading. Big THANK YOU's to the following: Charles McBride, Jane Wallace, Lois Koch, and Rev. McBride for working the finances; Kathy Winders and her team of story tellers for sharing pumpkin joy in the patch with preschoolers from all across Casper; ALL who manned the Patch to sell pumpkins, gourds and baked good every evening and weekends; John Lansing for making the reminder phone calls; Carol Sage for making herself available to help out with whatever

needed to be done; Keith Rouse and Lyle Cox for working on our patch wagons; NCHS Leadership teachers and students for coming during the week to straighten the patch and move pallets; to the FCC preschool staff, Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts, leaders and boys for pitching in to put up and take down the tents, decorate, and work shifts in the patch; members of KW and NC Honor Societies & Student Councils, KW girls swim team and boys soccer team, Highland Park Youth and Haven on the Rock for their assistance in unloading pumpkins as well as representatives from Seton House.

Thank you to Stacy Ballard, our coordinator. Stacy was our liaison with the Patch suppliers; worked on printing of sales slips, was responsible for TV and newspaper marketing, picked up and retrieved hay bales for the gazebo area, arranged the banner on the front fence, ordered the Porta-potty, worked on decorations and on the removal of decorations, assisted with opening the patch when necessary and recruited and coordinated the youth volunteers from the community!

While our sales were down this year due to more pumpkins on sale elsewhere in Casper, we still covered our expenses, and provided a beautiful and safe autumn setting for preschoolers and our community, as well as for numerous families who come to our patch to take family photos. FCC's pumpkin patch supports the general budget of FCC by providing funds for youth activities, including camp registrations, mission trips, and VBS, which previously were funded totally by the general budget. Community outreach has also included preschool scholarships for families in need. The following is a financial breakdown of our profit, expenses, and the allotment of that profit:
