Fall Blessings! Dear FCC Family & Friends -



Pastor's For some members of FCC, last week was been a strange & stressful week. For some it's been busy or normal or On any given Sunday, we may have no idea that the person sitting next to us in church has just come through a life-changing experience, the person

behind us may be living through a crisis, the person in front of us may be filled with exhilaration and joy. Every week, as you settle into your pew, I encourage you to offer a silent prayer for the people sitting closest to you - that God will meet them where they are, take care of whatever need they have, and bless them with peace in the coming week.

On Sunday, Oct. 11, during prayer sharing time, Amber Rouse asked us to pray for neighbors in Evansville affected by a fire. As we prayed together, we had no idea that the afternoon's vicious winds would whip the flames into a wildfire tearing across the grasslands, pastures & properties northeast of town. Russ & Julie Black were among those affected. They had 30 minutes or less to load up horses and get out of the house before the fire crested the ridge near where they live in the Cole Creek area. Russ pulled out of the pasture as the flames hit their fenceline. Thankfully, Jeff & Kelly Hover who live north of the burn area, had plenty of pasture to share and gladly sheltered the Black's horses while they were under evacuation orders and went to spend the night with daughter Sarah & family. Several of you also asked about Jack Walts' home. Thankfully the air tankers were able to halt the advance of the fire before it hit the area where Jack's home is. It was a couple of tense nights for the Blacks as they were evacuated, not knowing what would happen to their land and being unable to do anything but pray.... Russ and Julie are back in their home and so thankful that their property was spared. They are praying for neighbors who were not so fortunate. Please pray for all affected by the fire.

Our stewardship campaign is underway. One of the key texts comes from 1 Timothy 6. Verse 7 says: for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content. Have you ever thought about how little we truly NEED compared to how much we might WANT? When my father was a boy, his family home burned to the ground. Very little in terms of material possessions could be saved - yet, thankfully they all survived. Grandpa Dobson went on to rebuild their home and it was filled with many happy memories through the years. During my recent trip to Alamogordo, my sister and I cleaned out Mom's closet, giving away many clothes and shoes to local charities. It's amazing how many possessions we all gather through the years. What if all of your "stuff" was gone tomorrow, but you still had your family and food and clothing? How would it feel? Could you be "content"? Part of growing as Christian stewards is learning to "let go" of the things of this world so that we can "store up the treasure of a good foundation for the future" and "take hold of the life that really is life." (1 Tim. 6:19)

As you prepare to turn in a pledge card to support the coming year of ministry at FCC, May you rejoice in knowing that you truly are FREE in Christ! May you be "content" with what you have and be blessed to "set your hope on God, to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share." (from 1 Tim.617-18)
