Entering into Holiness

Once again I am on the journey of reading through the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. Currently in the Old Testament, I've been reading the details of constructing the Tent of meeting and the description of the "Holy of Holies" - that area around the altar where ancient priests offered sacrifices on behalf of the Israelites. It's an interesting place to be in my daily devotions during Holy Week as I ponder how much the practice of worship for God's people was transformed by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. No longer is there a physical space where only clergy are allowed. "The temple of the curtain was torn in two" when Jesus died on the cross, covering the gap between heaven and earth and allowing all believers to come close to God without an intermediary. Jesus himself became the passover lamb, and no longer is an animal sacrifice demanded as atonement for our sins.

Yet, even though we do not observe a "holy of holies" space in our sanctuary, I always feel during Holy Week that we are invited into a more holy space - not one with physical dimension, but a sacred space in time designed to be at the very center of our lives as people of faith. During Holy Week, I know I will see FCC'ers at the ecumenical service every day at noon at the Methodist Church. I am looking forward to our Maundy Thursday worship around tables in Fellowship Hall, as we hear the story of Passover and share communion. On Good Friday, I expect that many of you will come to spend time in prayer in the sanctuary during an "open house" prayer vigil. On Easter Sunday, some of you will be in worship at Three Crowns at 6:30 a.m. as we share a sunrise service with the members of First Methodist. Others will worship at 10:10 in our sanctuary (and hopefully bring a friend along). Yet others of you may be on the road, sharing time in worship elsewhere with families out of town. Through all these experiences, I pray that you will truly feel closer to God, you will enter into holiness and meet Jesus Christ pause at the cross this week and ponder his willingness to take away our sin. Enter through the door of the empty tomb and look out upon a world changed forever.

Once we enter into the place where God dwells, once we invite God to dwell within us, we are forever changed. Wherever we go, we simultaneously carry Christ to share with others and meet Him there - already waiting for us to see His face in the hungry and homeless, the young and the aged, the wise and the wondering. Will you enter into God's presence this Easter season? Will you let Christ's holiness enter into your life? - praying for our shared journey, Pastor Cynthia

THE NEW SIGN

One of the additions at FCC during 2015 was an update to the sign in front of the church. Our previous sign was literally falling apart, with a metal frame rusted through in places. It had served us well for many years, but those volunteers and staff who climbed up on a ladder to physically change the letters are truly thankful they don't need to do so ever again!!! A proposal was brought forward by the property commission and approved by the church board to put our new sign in place. Its state-of-theart electronic display is updated regularly by our office staff. The full color display is attractive as well as informative and has drawn the notice of numerous Casperites. This sign improves our visibility to drivers on CY and may help with evangelism by attracting visitors. Thank you to all who supported this project. The sign was \$13,974 + \$3,017 (installation) = \$16,991 total cost. The sign was paid for by sign gifts of \$2,550 and \$14,441 from memorials.

GOOD FRIDAY - ANNUAL PRAYER VIGIL "A NEW TAKE ON OLD TRADITIONS" - FRIDAY, MARCH 25, 2016

8:00 A.M. - 8:00 P.M. - Sanctuary open for prayer. "Come and go" for personal prayer and reflection....

Did you know that it was Rev. Frank See who introduced the idea of "prayer vigil" to our congregation? Rev See pastored FCC from 1957-1964. During his tenure, he introduced the practice of a 24-hour prayer vigil before Christmas and Easter. The tradition of an Easter prayer vigil continued for many decades. In recent years, with changes in membership and different daily schedules in our members' lives, it has been challenging to maintain a "24 hour" vigil. This year the elders of FCC invite you to experience a "new take" on this beloved tradition. On Good Friday, for 12 hours, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., the sanctuary will be open afor you to come and pray. Sit anywhere in the sanctuary you wish. Stay for as short or as long a time as you choose. There will be devotional materials and communion elements available for your use. Please enter and exit quietly so as not to disturb others who may be in prayer at the same time. Please use the elevator entrance and leave the door unlocked behind you. Elders and board members are serving as hosts throughout the day so no one will be alone in the building at any time.
