Pastor's Post

SUMMER REFRESHMENT

Imagine it's a hot summer day.... you've been working out in the sun... Then someone offers you a cold glass of water. "Ahh!" Few things taste so good. In your imagination, right now, picture yourself enjoying a cool treat on a hot

day - perhaps a juicy slice of chilled watermelon or a nice bowl of your favorite ice cream. Summer refreshment can take many forms. For some, it's a day at the lake, boating with friends or fishing at sunrise. For others, a trip to visit family or a long planned vacation can brighten the entire year by that special gift of a little time away.

In June, I was blessed to enjoy some spiritual refreshment. I spent a week at the Benedictine "Lady of Guadalupe" Abbey in Pecos, NM studying medieval illustrated manuscripts with Randall Hasson, an artist and calligrapher from Santa Fe. This week of continuing education was enhanced by the lovely setting of simple adobe buildings, surrounded by piñon pine forest along the Pecos River. Each day included prayer with the monks, listening and participating as they recited psalms and prayers. From there, I travelled to southern Colorado to spend a week just "hanging out" with my Dad, sister and her family. We stayed in a lovely cabin near Lake Vallecito East of Durango - reading, doing puzzles, playing games, kayaking, walking and talking.

I know that many of you will also have "time away" this summer. I pray that you return to FCC Casper feeling refreshed and renewed, revitalized in body and soul!

While I was at the Abbey, I sat in class one day, bent over the text I was carefully writing by hand in pen and ink, pondering each word, intentionally shaping each letter... I happened to look up and there was one of the brothers, laboring in the hot sun, weeding a flowerbed. His white cotton cowl was pulled over his head to cut out the sun's glare. Sweat dripped down a long, bushy grey beard as he leaned over a hoe. Quietly I stood up, slipped into the kitchen, and filled a cup with ice water. I walked out the side door and waited till he noticed me, then without speaking I held out the cup of cold water. It was a day of silence for the monks, when they don't speak between morning lauds and evening vespers. When he saw the cup in my hands, his face beamed with a wide grin. He reached out and took the cup, drinking steadily, slowly, in utter silence. Then he looked at me with bright eyes, mouthed the words "thank you," and immediately returned to his hoe. I walked back inside to my drawing board with words of scripture bouncing around my mind.... "And if you give even a cup of cold water to one of the least of my followers, you will surely be rewarded." (Matthew 10:42 - New Living Translation also found in Mark 9:41.) I was humbly aware, in that moment, that if Christ had been physically present, I could have offered no greater gift than the sip of cold water I'd just given to a happy monk.

I was not aware just how much I'd needed a vacation until I'd been at the Abbey a few days. I found myself relaxing, letting go of concerns, thankful to be "unplugged" from emails and social media, confident that all would be well at church while I was away. Sometimes, when you're hard at work, you don't even notice how thirsty you get until someone offers you a cold drink - and suddenly you down an entire glass and know you could drink more. Is your soul thirsty this summer? Take some time to walk under a pine tree on Casper Mountain. Let yourself JUST BE - sit and watch a sunset or notice the full moon. I will be away a little in July as well - for a quick trip to Indiana for Charles' family reunion - and then to Ring Lake for more continuing ed. Whether you are on the road this summer or staying home, I pray you savor some summer refreshment. "Ahh!" May you be blessed to be a blessing. - Pastor Cynthia


