Capital Campaign Update: We are continuing to work with contractors on the building repair projects outlined by the recent capital campaign. The foundation/concrete work and parking lot are complete. The wall repair in front of the church's main entrance is in process. The new windows have arrived and installation is beginning soon. We are "on the list" with a roofing company that specializes in flat roofs to resurface the roof over the offices, hallways and education building. Depending on weather, this may be held until after winter to begin. Care is being taken to complete the work around the schedules of numerous activities at the church, including the Pumpkin Patch and Preschool classes. Update on Pumpkins: The truck arrived at 2:37 pm Oct. 4th. Last weekend's craft fair was a success with vendors filling Fellowship Hall.
