#### **EUROPEAN ITINERARY**

Charles and I are so fortunate to be traveling to visit our exchange student "sons." Several members of the congregation have asked me to share our plans so that you can "follow along" as we travel. We appreciate your prayers while on this journey, and I'm so thankful for the elders stepping up to help cover visits and other pastoral care needs while I'm away. There will be several special worship experiences during this time as well.

On Wednesday, May 10, we drive to Denver and stay with Jane and Don Baker. On May 11, we'll fly from Denver to Rome, via Detroit on Delta Airlines, arriving Friday morning the 12th.

Having never been in Italy before, we're looking forward to a full week in Rome. We plan to visit the coliseum and the Vatican, including St. Peter's Basilica and the Sistine Chapel, the pantheon as well as numerous historic sites and churches across the city. It's our hope that Emanuelle will have time off from his job at British Airways to join us for a few days while we're in Italy. Even if Emanuelle isn't there to make introductions, we'll be able to meet his parents. The second week in Italy is divided between Florence and Venice. I'm very excited to see the Florence Duomo (cathedral) with its magnificent dome designed by Filippo Brunelleschi. Charles is equally excited to see the sites of Venice, and of course we'll enjoy local cuisine.

From Italy, we head to Germany. We'll take the train to Munich, where our German son Stefan is in graduate school. After a few days with him, we're off to Prague. The capital of the Czech Republic, Prague is a beautiful city - with the Charles Bridge, well preserved castle, and amazing historic architecture, but the "sites" we're looking forward to are a bit more personal. In 2012, we went to Slovakia to attend the wedding of Dominik and Suzana. Our Slovak son and his lovely bride are now the parents of little Samuel. One of the absolute highlights of the trip will be meeting our first "grandbaby" and having time with Dominik and Suzka. From there, we're back to Germany, stopping in Berlin for just a couple nights to check in with Friedrich Köhler; some of you may recall when he was an exchange student in Casper, living with the Budacks.

The next leg of our train travels will take us north - to another country we'll visit for the first time: Sweden. We'll stay with William and his family in Kalmar, catching up on life with all of them while seeing the sites of southern Sweden. That's followed by a few more days as tourists in Stockholm. (Our Norwegian student, Peder, won't have any time off from work or school until later in the summer, but his mum Karianne may come over to Stockholm for a quick visit.) Then we're back to Rome on an overnight train, and flying to Denver on June 13. After another night with the Bakers, we drive back to Casper and I'll see you all in worship on Father's Day, June 18.

I look forward to sharing stories of this trip upon my return - and will have plenty of pictures for those who are interested. Thank you to the numerous travelers from our church who've made suggestions of things to see along the way.


#### **CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR GRADUATING 2ND GRADERS & SENIORS**
