#### THE WORK OF CHRISTMAS

As I write this article, Charles and I are packing up to leave town for the Thanksgiving holiday. We'll drive to the southwest corner of Colorado to meet my Dad, my sister and her family (including out new great nephew). We'll stay at Debbie and Paul's cabin relaxing, cooking turkey, working jigsaw puzzles, laughing, and taking long walks in the piñon covered hills near Navajo Lake. The real joy of the trip will just be BEING together.

I've been excited about this get-away. You see, often the first Sunday of Advent falls immediately after Thanksgiving, and it just never feels like that's an ideal time to be away from the work of ministry - but this year, we have an "extra" Sunday before Advent begins. I'm not sure why it sometimes seems like "work" to get ready for a trip - washing laundry, packing, planning and taking care of all the last minute things I'd intended to do sooner. For some reason, this has got me thinking about the kind of work that might have been going on in heaven before Jesus came to earth... there wasn't a suitcase to pack, but the star that guided the magi needed to be polished extra bright, the heavenly host tuned up like they never had before, and the spirits of the saints that whisper to the prophets were putting in overtime for sure... The excitement of Jesus' coming birth could barely be contained! How does that compare with the work that we earthly beings do at Christmas? ...shopping and wrapping gifts, planning special meals and parties, sending cards with just the right message, baking cookies, hosting, visiting, hoping... and as church folk, whether you're on staff, an elder or sing in the choir - there are special services to plan and, yes, extra work to do... Sometimes, does it just seem like Christmas is a lot of work?

I invite you to TAKE A BREATH. As this holy time of year begins, give yourself the grace to know - it won't all be perfect (no matter how hard you try) - and that's okay. Choose the activities that bring you joy and bring you closer to God. Honor those family traditions that are most precious, but also allow yourself to let go of a few things and do a little less.

You see - from a theological perspective - the "work" of Christmas is much more internal than external. Giving yourself a little extra time each morning to read a daily devotional, taking a leisurely walk in your neighborhood and really noticing the world around you, pausing to listen... The work of Christmas is unfolding already as each of us makes a manger bed in our hearts with enough room to welcome the Christ child. The work of Christmas begins in Advent, but it continues throughout our lives, when we feed the hungry, welcome a stranger and comfort the hurting. Advent, in a sense, is the preparation season for all the rest of the Christian life - helping us learn each year to walk so closely with God that the straw of a Bethlehem stable clings to our shoes all the way to Calvary.






#### **UPCOMING YOUTH ACTIVITIES**

#### The Sun Sets on the 2017 Pumpkin Patch.....

What a blessing it was for our church to have the Preschool teachers take over management of the Pumpkin Patch this year. After being the "pumpkin patch church" for over a dozen years, this was a new level of partnership that brought mutual blessings! We paid a "patch management fee" to the Preschool staff to compensate for their many hours, and this takes off the burden of their annual fundraiser. Thanks especially to Teacher Chanel McCash who was the lead patch manager and to Preschool Director Annette Crain for the financial reporting. They learned a lot, worked hard and had fun. Chanel and Annette learned the Patch takes a LOT of work behind the scenes — and it is not possible for one group to do it alone.

THANK YOU to ALL of the Patch workers! From unloading the truck to selling pumpkins, hosting story times, to putting away the last pallet, we had lots of help from church, Scout/Cub and Preschool families plus students and friends beyond the church. Thanks to everyone's hard work and the generosity of Casperites, we again

passed the \$20,000 sales mark — which means we got to keep 35% as profit. This year we reported a total of \$21,205.90 in pumpkin sales to the Pumpkin Patch Fundraiser company. (If you want to learn more about where our pumpkins come from, visit <a href="www.pumpkinsusa.com">www.pumpkinsusa.com</a>). All of the sales shifts and set up times were counted, then divided up between each group that worked to share a percent of the profits based on hours given as follows: preschool 41%, church 36%, Boy Scouts 14% and Cubs 9%. Individual donations to each group were tracked and added in.

**FINAL FIGURES:** CWF earned \$311 in bake sales which they will donate to Hospice. The youth will receive \$266.75 from the craft fair, hot dog lunch and pie sale. The Boy Scouts netted \$732.22 and the Cubs earned \$494.44. The Preschool's share of the sales was \$2,055.56. And the church is honored to announce that **\$1,000** has been given to the Olivia Caldwell Foundation to help with pediatric cancer research.
