## **Sharing Baptismal Waters**

Most of the time I was in seminary, I served as the "student pastor" at Morgan Christian Church, a small rural congregation in central Kentucky. The historic building with beautiful stained glass windows and carved wooden pews didn't have a baptistry. Over my three years there, I had the privilege of baptizing young people in the congregation. Some of the baptisms took place in the cool, flowing waters of the

Licking River, which ran right next to the church and eventually joins the Ohio River. One year, Easter came early and the River would be far to cold for baptisms - so we "borrowed" the baptistry at another Disciples of Christ Church in the county. (I remember that day as the host pastor loaned me his waders to wear, without realizing they had a hole in the toe...)

Recently, FCC Casper had the opportunity to "loan" our baptistry to another church in town. Obviously, if you practice baptisms by immersion, you usually don't just pick up your baptismal tank and drive it across town - instead the guest users come to you. It's a special opportunity to practice Christian hospitality. All those years ago, a pastor stayed late on a Sunday afternoon to open his church and welcome members from the Morgan congregation as we came to celebrate a baptism. This past Sunday, I got to "return the favor" in a sense - or at least "pass it on" to another group of Christ's followers. The Community of Christ Church meets in a commercial setting here in Casper, so they obviously don't have a baptistry. Last weekend they hosted a youth retreat for their denomination and there were three young people ready to be baptized. On Saturday I cleaned and filled our "tank" and made sure the heater was running. I made space between all the items stored in our dressing rooms for the candidates to change out of dripping wet clothes. Then on Sunday, I waited around after our worship and fellowship time had ended.

Pastor Barb Gardner and her husband Bill showed up first, eventually followed by a group of about 30 folks - young people, families and elders. They sang camp songs (most of which I knew), read scripture (the story of Jesus' baptism), and celebrated the holy act of baptizing three new young Christians. It was a sacred privilege just to sit in the back pew and watch this special time of worship by some of our Christian neighbors.

Sometimes, we think of our "church family" as being the other members of First Christian Casper - the people we know well who sit next to us on Sunday, sing with us in worship, teach our children in Sunday School or make sandwiches with us on a Saturday morning. Other times, we intentionally remember the broader connection we have as part of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) - praying for other congregations in the Central Rocky Mountain Region or contributing to the Easter offering to support Disciples missionaries around the world. Yet truly, our "Christian family" is broader still - everyone who proclaims the belief that "Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God" is my sister or brother in Christ. Everyone who has been baptized "in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit" (whether sprinkled in a font, dunked in a river or immersed in a church baptistry) - every baptized believer shares the same gift of salvation and responsibility of faith that we share.
