




### A Light for the Nations

We are in the season of Epiphany - those days following January 6th when we remember the visit of the magi to the Christ child, when the church traditionally hears texts from the prophets and recalls the story of John the Baptist baptizing Jesus. This time at the beginning of each calendar year marks the *journey* from Christmas to Lent.

This year, Ash Wednesday will fall on March 1st. We will again have special worship services (& a soup supper) hosted by our elders weekly on Wednesday evenings through Lent.

For me, personally, a key part of the Christmas/Epiphany story is its amazing inclusiveness. Jesus was visited by shepherds - no doubt a rag-tag, scraggly bunch who'd been sleeping in the fields - AND the magi - though not necessarily *three kings* according to scripture, they no doubt were well studied foreigners with enough resources to travel far and bring costly gifts. God's Son Jesus came as a living gift to those "with means" and those with nothing, to the locals and people from far away. Last Sunday, we heard from Isaiah 49, when God spoke to the Servant Messiah saying, "I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth."

For many people in the world, there has been a definite view of America as a "Christian" nation. Our founding fathers incorporated many ideals of faith into the founding documents of this country. Though as citizens we might squabble about it every few decades, our currency says "in God we trust" and the pledge of allegiance speaks of "one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." The very nature of inclusivity is often hailed as both a Christian and an American ideal - but it is not always easy.

As a nation of immigrants, we struggle to treat with respect those whose language, food, culture and customs are different from our own - even when it makes us stronger as a people and enriches our lives. In his speech at the Martin Luther King/Equality Day celebration, former Casper mayor Daniel Sandoval lifted up an anecdote of a typical encounter in an American city - when an Arabic taxi driver drops off his Italian passenger on a corner in Chinatown where she can buy a sushi taco from a French girl at a food truck. He celebrated the richness of food and music enhanced by having multiple influences - perhaps that's part of the unique delight we enjoy as Americans. I am distressed that there seems to be a growing divide in our nation, an undercurrent of mistrust and mistruths, a rhetoric of hating foreigners or even a new social norm emerging that it's okay to be mean to our neighbors next door just because they're different from us. This is surely a time when the church needs to again answer God's call to be a "Light" and an embodiment of holy love - for all the nations AND for our own nation.

Sometime this Spring, our Christian Ed team is planning a field trip for our children & youth to visit Heart Mountain, the site of a Japanese internment camp in Wyoming during WWII. It will be a powerful experience to face a time in our history when fear and mistrust got the upper hand. In the late 1950's and early '60's my mother was an advocate in the Civil Rights movement. In her own brave, quiet way, she did what she understood to be God's work - by registering African American citizens to vote in Peoria, IL and then teaching English to Chinese American immigrants in California. When I see the evil face of racism and injustice begin to rear its head again in my own lifetime, I find myself asking: what would my mother do? What would Jesus do? Who would God love? ALL OF US - so, I must do the same. May your life this year be graced by love and light - and may you add to what IS good in the world around us. - *Pastor Cynthia McBride*
