The Journey isn't over till the "telling" is done...

A friend quoted Fred Craddock to me today. I know I don't have the words exactly right, but the gist of his insight was the importance of sharing the story of our travels through life. It's certainly true for faith - Living the Gospel isn't complete until we tell others about the love we have in Jesus!

Charles and I have returned from our month-long trek in Europe. One week ago, as I write this, we were completing an extended journey by train from Gothenburg Sweden to Rome. Over a stretch of 29 hours, we travelled by 5 trains (including missing one connection in Bologna and having to catch the next train an hour later). We took both high-speed express trains (traveling up to 198 km/hour) and regional trains that stopped frequently in small towns. We shared a 4-person berth on an overnight train with two German bicyclists who were headed to the Alps and toasting their journey with California Gallo wine. We were even on a train on a boat - crossing from Denmark to northern Germany on a "train ferry"... It was a long way home... We slept for about 5 hours in a hotel in Rome, then headed to the airport.

The "telling" of our travels will unfold in the weeks ahead, through stories shared in sermons and pictures offered for viewing for those who'd like to see. We were so blessed on this trip! I was inside 20 different churches, taking photos in most of them, sharing in worship in a few. We had quality time with four of "our boys" and so enjoyed visiting with two sets of parents of our exchange student sons. During the first week of our trip, Emmanuelle's folks, Tina and Alberto, took us out for a wonderful afternoon & evening drive in the country north of Rome, sharing traditional regional Italian cuisine at one of their favorite restaurants in the small town of Ariccia. In southern Sweden, during the last week of our trip, we stayed with William's parents, Tomas and Anneli in their beautiful, simple, peaceful home looking out at the Baltic Sea in the small town of Kalmar. We had breakfast on their garden patio and stayed up late talking about families and faith. (Tomas has just completed three years as chairman of the ecumenical church of Sweden.) I experienced incredible Christian hospitality at Peace United Methodist Church in Munich, Germany when I joined Pastor Christine and her international, English-speaking congregation for worship on the Sunday while Charles was unexpectedly hospitalized. I stood in wonder, neck-bent back, staring up at the incredibly detailed painting of Michelangelo on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel. We rode "tourist" buses and boats to see the sites, enjoyed coffee & gelato and the flavors of four nations. We visited museums (in Stockholm we saw both a 1600's sailing vessel and memorabilia of the 1970's group ABBA). All along the way, I thought of you and gave thanks for your prayers.

Thank you to Dennis Baker, Paul Hallock, Amber French, all of the elders, Diane, Kathy, Leigh and every one here at FCC who continued on in ministry. When campers & counselors come back from camp, they are often filled with stories of the ways in which they saw God. I feel rather like that - home from camp / my summer adventure away - with faith lifted up, eager to tell of what I've seen, and in so doing to continue to journey....

We all hope, as we go along, that at least some of those lessons resonate for the boys. Through campouts, bike rodeos, day camps, den meetings, pumpkin trucks, and pinewood derbies, I have a million happy memories. Thank you to all my wonderful scouts, past and present, for the smiles and laughter, the fist bumps and pies in the face. I hope with all my heart you continue walking down the trail that leads to that mountain, and work to "Do Your Best."
