"It Takes A Village"

Giving Thanks for Our Church Family

There's a Nigerian saying, "It takes a whole village to raise a child." This proverb expresses the African view of important family relationships, concern for others, and a willingness to share even self-sacrificially, especially for the benefit of children who are seen as a gift from God for the whole community. The expression "It takes a

village" was popularized in America after its 1996 use as a book title by Hillary Clinton. It has since entered our general psyche as short-hand for the reminder that all of our lives are interconnected. Not just when we're raising a child, but throughout life, there are indeed times when it takes a group of people offering shared support for one to not just make it but to thrive in life.

Over the past month, I have been deeply grateful for the "village" that is First Christian Church Casper. On March II (I remember because it was the day after my birthday) I woke up with a sore throat. Charles had suffered from a bad cold the week or two before that, so I figured, in spite of being careful, I'd caught his cold. I suffered through an increasing list of symptoms - congestion, headache, cough - expecting to get better with time. I toughed it out for well over two weeks but was just not beating the cough, so I finally went to the doctor. Without hesitation, his diagnosis was swift, "You've got the flu." He started me on an antibiotic and explained that, though I had gotten a flu shot, the vaccine just wasn't as effective this year as usual.

Many of our FCC members and others in town have suffered respiratory ills this winter. Now, I'm among them. Preparing for worship on April 2nd, I'd been fighting the cough and wasn't sure how strong my voice would be. So, instead of speaking from memory as I usually do, I wrote out a manuscript and asked the elder that day (who happened to be my husband Charles) to read portions of it so I could rest my voice as we alternated back and forth on a text exploring Jesus' last words on the cross. It was a good way to continue the Lenten "stations of the cross" series. As is the pattern with this influenza, my health would improve slightly and then worsen over the coming weeks. I again wrote out a manuscript for Palm Sunday. That day, while I was home in bed with fever and chills, the preaching fell to elder chair Dennis Baker who took the theme I'd given and expanded on it. In 25+ years of ministry, I'd never missed worship on Palm Sunday - nor spent so much of Holy Week sick in bed! Pastor Brenda from Grace Lutheran filled in for me at the Wednesday noon service. Finally, on Thursday, I ventured out for a little office time and to share in leading our Maundy Thursday service.

I've been through two rounds of antibiotics. The last doctor I saw tells me most people need at least a full six weeks to get over this - so I'm on track for being well in another week or so. I'm truly "tired of being tired" - but also humbled to be reminded of how much we need each other. I'm thankful for Kathy & Leigh and the work they faithfully do in the church office, whether I'm there multiple hours each day or checking in by phone from my sick bed. I'm thankful for elders who visit homebound members when I'm hesitant to visit them myself even though the doc insists I'm not "contagious" at this point. Thank you to everyone in our church family for your thoughts and prayers, for soup and cards, and for making sure that ministry goes on! "It takes a village" - it takes all of us, using our many gifts, to live God's reign into being in tangible ways. THANK YOU for being part of Christ's "village" here in Casper! - Blessings! - Pastor Cynthia


