THE GIFT OF A SINGLE LIFE

This week I met with the young people of FCC who are participating in the God and Life program. One of their assignments is to interview a member of the clergy and ask about what it means to be called to the life of being a pastor. One of the questions they asked me was, "What is your favorite verse of scripture?" My life verse is Romans 8:26. My mother's verse was Romans 8:28. (It's touching to me to

know that this same verse is shared by Betty Axworthy.) In the NRSV, it says, "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." (Another translation reads that *God works for good in all things...*) There are times in life that it can be hard for us to see the good. When a child dies, how can that be good? My understanding of this verse of scripture is that, even when truly bad things happen, God is still at work. God is at work for good in spite of the bad in this world. God alone can bring hope and healing out of tragedy, even years later. God is at work in ways we cannot see or fathom at times. Perhaps that's part of why Romans 8:26 means so much to me: "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words."

When I was only five years old, my little sister Valerie died of leukemia. She was four. Losing a child at such a young age shapes an entire family. For the rest of our earthly life, our love for her is still with us. In ways that are difficult to express in words, it forms a bond with other families who know a similar loss, even with people we may never meet.

I want to tell you the story of Olivia. Olivia Caldwell was diagnosed with brain cancer in July 2012, when she was just 4 months old. She endured numerous surgeries and 7 months of high intensity chemo. By early 2013, doctors thought they'd gotten all of the tumor cells. Her last day of chemo was February 13, 2013 and the Caldwell family enjoyed a few months of "normalcy," even though Olivia was living with effects from her tumor, including right side weakness, developmental delays, compromised vision and epilepsy. In June 2013, Olivia was rushed to Children's Hospital Colorado in Denver. Her brain tumor had come back and was even bigger than before. The medical battle resumed with another port surgery and weekly chemo. Her tumor remained stable for about four months, until Olivia began to decline in late September 2013. October 17, 2013 was the day Olivia's family found out there was nothing more that could be done. She went home with hospice care and passed away in the arms of her mother and father just 5 days later at 20 months and 3 days old. She left behind her mommy, daddy and her twin brother, Wyatt.

When the Preschool teachers took on leadership of the FCC Pumpkin Patch this year, they requested that the local charity we benefit in 2017 be somehow related to caring for children. After extensive conversation and investigation, the FCC Executive Board approved sharing this year's Pumpkin Patch proceeds with the Olivia Caldwell Foundation. The mission of the Olivia Caldwell Foundation: To fund life-saving pediatric cancer research and programs to improve the lives of children battling cancer. As I watch children come to the Patch for story time, smiling brightly as they play among the piles of pretty orange pumpkins and multicolored squash, I find myself feeling grateful to know that a portion of this year's proceeds will bring a smile to other children as well and to Casper families who spend weeks on end at Children's Hospital in Denver. - Pastor Cynthia
