# **God's Timing**

## A Daughter's Pastoral Word

Not every congregation can handle their pastor being gone on Easter Sunday - so, first of all, let me say THANK YOU. Thank you to Dennis Baker who preached on short notice on April 1 and to Bob McNamara who was our pulpit guest on April 8. Thank you to our staff and lay leaders who carried on in ministry as I was called away suddenly by my father's illness.

On Palm Sunday, Dad's friends at First Christian in Alamogordo noticed something was a little "off" with Tommy. They called my sister, 70 miles away in Las Cruces, and she and husband Paul drove over to check on Dad. He complained about a headache that had been going on awhile, but then he took something and seemed to feel better. After dinner, they extracted a promise from Dad that he'd see his doctor.

Long story short... without any clear cause, he'd had a subdural hematoma, a "brain bleed." On Monday, March 26, he was life-flighted from the E.R. in Alamogordo to a regional trauma center in El Paso, TX. I was there by Wed. night to see him in ICU after he'd had the first of two craniotomies. Over the next two weeks, Debbie and I made the journey that many others make - spending long hours in hospital waiting rooms, rejoicing when he progressed out of ICU, and praying "without ceasing." By Tuesday, April 10th, Dad was fully himself again - funny, quiet at times but very articulate, walking well and gaining strength. With great relief, I flew home Wed. We knew there were risks ahead - a return of the bleed, cardiac complications, mobility or speech deficits, short-term memory loss just to name a few - but Dad was Dad again.

On Friday morning, I'd just backed out of our garage to drive to church and lead preschool chapel when my sister called. They'd taken Dad to the E.R. in Las Cruces with chest pains. We tried to reassure each other that this was just a bump in the road. As the day unfolded, the news became harder to hear. Dad had a heart attack at the hospital. Because of brain bleed issues, the cardiologist couldn't treat his arterial blockage with a stint, but the doctors were still more worried about his brain than his heart. Friday afternoon, I was at a retreat with other clergy-women in Casper. I shared what was happening with apologizes if I had to step out to take a call. Updates continued to come.... things weren't looking good... We closed our time together with these wonderful women of God gathering around me as I sat in a well-worn rocking chair. They laid their hands lightly on my head and shoulders and spoke words of grace, words of courage and strength and peace rooted in our shared faith. They prayed for me, for my family, for our congregation, and most of all for my Dad - that God would watch over him and take care of him. The last friend said, "Amen," and my phone rang. My sister said simply, "He's gone." There, in a living room in Casper, the Spirit of God had been invoked to guide my Dad from yet another Intensive Care Room to his place in eternity - to be greeted by Marilyn, his wife of 55 years, and their two children, David and Valerie, as well as his beloved Lord and Savior Jesus. It was a holy moment and I slipped off my shoes as Moses did long ago.

Throughout the two weeks we'd shared together, there were countless moments of grace - glimpses of God's hand guiding all that unfolded. I was able to go quickly to be with family. I had already planned to be gone the Sunday after Easter so the pulpit was covered. I modified my plan to fly to Arizona for the "Wild Women of the West" event to thinking I could drive. The morning I would've left town, Dad went back to the hospital and I was still there as we faced his second surgery. As soon as we'd shared prayer with his neurosurgeon and nurse, an OR opened and Dad was rushed to surgery. Charles drove over from AZ to surprise us all with a visit at the hospital, never thinking it would be his last chance to see our last living parent. It can sound trite to tell a grieving person, "it was his time" when a loved one dies, but in this case - I do believe it was God's timing. There will be a glorious celebration of life for my father on May 5 at First Christian Church in Alamogordo, NM. Please continue to pray for my family in the weeks ahead as we lovingly remember a truly good man - loving Christian father, community volunteer, retired engineer, dedicated church leader, who now shares his sweet tenor voice with heaven's choir. - Pastor Cynthia


