Health Insurance Costs

Due to the rising costs of medical care, our denomination ended the "Churchwide Healthcare" insurance plan offered to Disciples of Christ clergy at the end of 2016. Both Dec. 2016 and 2017 brought *significant* increases in the cost of health insurance available to our pastor. This year, Rev. McBride enrolled in Christian Healthcare Ministries, cutting costs to the church in half. CHM is a health cost sharing plan, with both a prescription reduction and catastrophic care component.

If you or someone you know is struggling to find an affordable health insurance plan, Pastor Cynthia is willing to discuss the pros and cons of Christian Healthcare Ministries with you.


WEEK OF COMPASSION UPDATE

Hurricane Florence came ashore the North Carolina coast the morning of Sept. 14. Winds of 90 m.p.h., storm surges of over 10 feet, and rain rates over 1" per hour caused devastation. The impact zones include several hundred Disciples congregations, many at risk of significant damage. Week of Compassion is partnering across our Disciples community and with ecumenical partners to respond in many ways to the tremendous need.

- Christmount Conference Center is hosting over 90 evacuees.
- Congregations in multiple states have offered their buildings as shelter for evacuees.
- Southwood Memorial Christian Church in Kinston, NC is working with local emergency management to host a mobile medical center on their campus.
- The Regional Office in North Carolina has been coordinating with congregations to preposition clean-up supplies and identify local resources.
- Our ecumencial partner, Children's Disaster Services, has teams providing childcare in shelters in North and South Carolina.

We also pray for people in the Pacific. Equivalent to a Category 5 hurricane, **Super Typhoon Manghkut** has been thrashing the northern islands of the Philippines. Week of Compassion is in communication with our partners in the Philippines and China and will respond as needed.
