GIVING THANKS for YOU!

I'm writing this column the night before I leave town for Thanksgiving. By the time The Call is printed, folded, mailed and delivered, some of you will have already finished your turkey feasts and perhaps be immersed in watching football, shopping for great sales or decorating your homes for Christmas. As I drive the 900 miles from Casper to my family home in

southern New Mexico, I'll have plenty of time to reflect on the many reasons I have to GIVE THANKS to the Lord. Top of the list is YOU - my church family.

What an amazing fall we've shared. FCC Casper did a superb job hosting the CRMR Fall Feast. Working together to support the Scout Troop during their first year of coordinating, we again had a successful Pumpkin Patch, welcoming families to our property, sharing story times, and raising funds for the Scouts, Preschool & FCC's youth. Just yesterday, nearly 100 people came to the annual Thanksgiving dinner and many of you invited guests to attend worship. I am thankful to serve a healthy, spiritually vibrant congregation.

When I reached the 10-year mark of full-time ordained ministry (back in 2005), the congregation I was serving showed their appreciation by increasing my annual vacation leave to four weeks. Upon accepting the call to be your pastor in 2009, the same vacation allowance was included in my contract. Earlier this year, I took time to be with my Dad while he was in the hospital and then returned for his funeral. The personnel committee allowed me bereavement leave for that hard journey. As I head south again, this time to help my sister continue the process of cleaning out our childhood home and preparing to sell the house in Alamogordo, I have been deeply touched by the personal words of encouragement from many of you who've made similar journeys through the process of decluttering and letting go of precious memories. I am thankful to serve a congregation that understands the importance of time for family.

Earlier this fall, the congregation voted to further pursue the process of calling an Associate Minister, in part using endowment funds, to strengthen and expand our ministries. The next steps are three-fold: to conduct a thorough review & updating of our online presence, to complete the "congregational profile" required for our denomination's Search & Call process, and to write a detailed job description for the position. After those 3 steps are completed, the official search committee will be appointed. If you are interested in helping with one of these three areas of detailed prep work, please speak with Linda Mosteller or Dennis Baker for further details. I am thankful to be part of a church family willing to take new steps!

In my childhood home, it was our tradition to hunt for the Christmas tree on the day after Thanksgiving. We'd drive up into the Sacramento Mountains, hike over hills in the National Forest permit-in-hand, and finally select just the perfect piñon pine to chop down and take home. I guess I'm a little old fashioned. I really can't get used to seeing Christmas items in the stores the day after Halloween. Or maybe it's just that my heart needs time to change seasons... When I take time to GIVE THANKS to God first for all of my blessings, I'm humbly aware how blessed I am to receive the greatest gift of all - Jesus Christ. QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DONATIONS

s ewardship Did you know----If you are 70 and 1/2 or older and are taking required sharing the gifts we have been given minimum distributions (RDMs) from a qualified retirement account (IRAs or 401(k)s etc.) you may transfer up to the amount of your RMD from your account directly to a qualified charity (FCC). That amount can be excluded from your taxable income. The maximum amount that can be donated is \$100,000 per year for single taxpayers and \$200,000 for taxpayers who are married and filing jointly. For a QCD to count towards your 2018 taxes, the funds must come out of your retirement account by December 31st. If you have any questions please contact your financial advisor or the Stewardship Commission.

APPRECIATED ASSETS DONATION

Donating appreciated assets to a qualified charity (FCC) may be a strategic way to take advantage of tax benefits available under current law. Giving appreciated assets held more than a year --such as low cost-basis stock--to qualified charities allows taxpayers to deduct the value of the asset from ordinary income without paying capital gains taxes. The gift is deductible as an itemized deduction up to 30% of adjust gross income. If you have questions, please contact your financial advisor or the Stewardship Commission.

Pumpkin Patch report

The final sale of pumpkins at the 2018 Pumpkin Patch was \$22,901. This put us into the 35% profit bracket. Expenses for the Patch this year included port-a-potty rental, new wagon wheels, and credit card fees. We are thankful to Mike Ward and the Boy Scouts for coordinating the Patch this year. The break-down of shifts & extra hours worked between our partner groups was as follows: FCC members covered 44%, Preschool 23% (\$1,207) Boy Scouts 19% (\$1,016) and Cub Scouts 15% (\$783). This does not include the administrative/Patch management hours. The hours worked by various groups determines their share of the profits. CWF earned \$315.50 on baked goods.

As a community outreach gift, the Olivia Caldwell Foundation will again receive \$1,000. The decision was made to support this pediatric cancer research organization for a second year because, with taking a "patch management fee" out of the profit (last year for the Preschool and this year for the Scouts), the amount available to help a community charity was significantly less than in prior years. Next fall, we will start the process again of selecting community charities, with FCC members able to suggest an area agency to receive a financial gift from the Patch. It is important that the church share these gifts beyond our congregation - 1) as a sign of Christ-based compassion, 2) to encourage the general public to be generous in their donations, and 3) to meet "community outreach guidelines" that allow school groups to volunteer to help in the Patch (such as with unloading the pumpkin truck).

THANK YOU to EVERYONE who helped with the Patch - truck unloading, tent setup & decorating, pallet setup and hauling to storage, story-times, sales shifts, covering/uncovering in inclement weather, prayer support, buying a pumpkin, inviting friends to come, posting pictures on social media, behind the scenes administration, and in other ways!

One of the greatest blessings of the Patch is seeing the delight on a child's face when they get to pick out their very own pumpkin. It's a great way to attract people, who would never darken the door of any church, to at least come to FCC, learn where we are and be greeted with a friendly welcome.

Mission Meal Serving

For more years than anyone seems to know, First Christian Church has taken a turn preparing and serving a meal once a month at the Central Wyoming Rescue Mission. THANK YOU to EVERYONE who has served in this way through the years! Thank you to those who've planned menus, shopped, cooked at home or at the church kitchen, baked cupcakes, carried food to the mission, given financial support or words of encouragement, and served and visited with the neighbors in our community who find themselves in need of shelter at CWRM. Through the years, our Christian Women's Fellowship has truly served too many meals to count. Moving forward, CWF will be giving financial support to the food budget at the Rescue Mission rather than continuing to cook and serve as they have for so long.

The generosity of many donors in Casper has made the construction of a much-needed, larger facility for the Rescue Mission possible. First Christian Church will continue to partner with CWRM by providing *servers* for the evening meal six times a year. Our Mission Commission will coordinate this effort. We are committed to helping serve on the **third Thursday** every other month in Nov., Jan., March, May, July, and September. Servers need to arrive at the Rescue Mission kitchen at 5:30 PM to receive instruction on your place in the line for that night's meal, which is served at 6 PM. Any age is welcome to volunteer. This may be something your family wants to do together, your Sunday School class or other small group. If you would also like to help prepare the meal, meal prep volunteers are asked to arrive at CWRM at 4:00 PM. To volunteer, please contact Debbie Mestas or Keith Rouse.

If you want to help at the Rescue Mission at another time or in another way, call them directly at 265-3002.

CHANGES COMING FOR CWF (name changed to Disciple Women's Ministries, DWM)

Even since before First Christian Casper was chartered in 1921, our women have gathered to share in fellowship and support one another in doing God's work. Our first "women's society" began in Casper in 1915. Nationally, the Christian Woman's Board of Missions had been working since 1874. In 1949 "CWF" was launched, and ever since, FCC Casper has had a strong participation in Christian Women's Fellowship. Through the decades there have been many changes. Different women have come and gone; we've shared in local ministries like Interfaith and serving meals at the Rescue Mission; and we've supported the work of our congregation through providing bereavement meals, helping fund building improvements, volunteering with the sandwich ministry, hosting Sunday morning coffees and all-church meals and more!

In 2006, the International Christian Women's Fellowship "ICWF" became International Disciples Women's Ministries "IDWM". Because of the familiarity of CWF, like our congregation, many Disciples churches continued to use the name CWF rather than DWM. The idea behind the name change was to indicate that ALL Disciples women are part of DWM, whether or not they belong to a CWF circle. Our women are discussing using the name DWM here in Casper as well - but there are some changes coming that are more significant than what we call ourselves.

Because of the age of our most involved women, and due to smaller numbers in our CWF/DWM circles, it has been decided that in 2019, there will not be a monthly CWF Executive Board meeting. Instead, we will have a "General" meeting for any and all women in the church who'd like to attend. These General Women's meetings will happen four times during the year - the first being **Thursday, January 3rd at 10:00 AM**. Please come! If you're a woman of FCC, if you enjoy being with other Christian believers, if you love Jesus, if you'd like to have a voice in women's work here or learn more or just have a fun morning of fellowship, we'd love to see you! Harriet Ames and Peg Jackson will co-chair these general meetings and the executive function of our women's ministries in 2019.

Our three women's circles continue to meet. **Circle #1 "Elizabeth-Ruth-Naomi"** meets second Thursdays at the church at 10 a.m. Contact Carol Sage. **Group #2 "Martha"** meets second Wednesdays at noon for a potluck salad lunch in Fellowship Hall. Contact Lani McBee or Virginia Yohn. **Group #3** meets monthly for a Dutch treat lunch at area restaurants. In December, they'll meet on 12/12 at 11:30 at Silver Fox. Contact Janie Nelson. **Godly Girlfriends** is a circle designed for working women. They meet evenings, usually when needed, on a Thursday at 5:30. Contact Randisue Davis or Melanie Dowler for information.

Disciples Women's Ministries is a conduit for diverse connections empowering each woman to find her voice and live out her call.
