CHANGING CALENDARS

As this issue of The Call goes to print, we are halfway through Advent - we've lit the candles for Hope and Peace, with the candles of Joy and Love yet to come. Yet at the same time, Christmas is *less* than two weeks away. That's rather unusual, but it's because this year Advent is the SHORTEST length possible, with Christmas Eve falling on a Sunday (and thus also being the fourth Sunday of Advent).

You'll notice there are a few dates listed for 2018 throughout this newsletter. As happens each year, we have a new team of board leaders and elders stepping up to take their turn at servant leadership in January. Recently, I've swapped out calendars that I use in my office. I've had a calendar up for much of the year that I received from the Tennyson Center in Denver. I like it because it features artwork by some of the many children Disciples and others help through the work at Tennyson, but it also annoyed me. It had an unusual format - with the dates lined up visually starting each week on Monday and ending on Sunday. All year long, when I'd glance at the calendar to quickly check a date, my brain would have to shift from the expectation of seeing Sunday at the beginning of the week.

I wonder if the calendar's format would've been any less annoying if I worked in a different setting. My work week, and surely my life, truly revolves around Sundays. On any given day, I'm thinking (at least peripherally) about what I'll be preaching on for the next Sunday. It's a rhythm of life familiar to clergy the world over. Interlaced with the repeating rhythm of weekly worship is the broader calendar of the church year... Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter, Pentecost.

What is the rhythm of your life? If you're a school teacher or college professor, then you're used to counting the weeks of each semester and savoring some time off over summer break. If you're an accountant, the deadlines of April 15th, Dec. 31st or the end of a fiscal year no doubt influence your work schedule. Of course we all have some rhythms of leisure activity as well - sports fans relish the annual festivities of the Super Bowl or World Series. Outdoorsmen know the opening day of hunting season or when their fishing license expires. How is your life rhythm this Advent? Have you made time to read a daily devotion, light a candle or say a prayer? Are you feeling overwhelmed with plans for Christmas preparations not yet completed? Take a breath. I'm sure there are things you still need or want to do. Which of them are the most important? What can you take off of your list? Would letting go of some self-imposed pressure help make this Christmas season more joyous and peace-filled for you? Then Let Go...

Ultimately, you can choose the rhythm of life you'd like to live. Even with work deadlines and family commitments, events that happen beyond your control, you can choose every day to do a little less or a little more. To rest or walk, to turn off the TV or pick up a book, to pause for longer conversation, to spend more time in prayer. A new year is coming when we'll change

calendars, and each of us can decide: what will be our rhythm of life? What will be at the heart of your life in 2018?

One of the songs the choir will sing in this Sunday's cantata has an excerpt from "We need a little Christmas." I think we might all need to carry a little Christmas with us all year long - a space in our hearts and lives (and calendars) set aside for Christ's presence.

May it be so. Advent Blessings. - Pastor Cynthia

A THANK YOU FROM CALVIN DECKER...... I want to begin by thanking the congregation for entrusting me with the care of our church home for the past three I also want to thank all whose giving made the Capital Campaign an unqualified success. Those funds have made our church more energy efficient, safer and more comfortable. We began by creating a new valley gutter and paving the north parking lot which has improved the draining making it safer in wet and freezing weather. A concrete walk was installed around the entire building, again for drainage. We installed 17 energy efficient window, replaced the shingles on the sanctuary roof, and installed a new seamless roof with more insulation on the rest of the building. New cooling duct work and a new air conditioner were installed for the sanctuary. We also had funds to replace the original breaker panel which had many breakers that had failed, a potential fire hazard, and also landscaped around the gazebo. I want to thank the people who donated the funds to replace the lighting in the sanctuary with high efficiency LED lighting, also to the individual who paid for the LED lighting in the kitchen and fellowship hall. A big thank you to the individual who paid for the new door coming into the fellowship hall thereby stopping the cold and mice from coming in. I also want to thank everyone who has helped me with repairs, painting, cleaning and especially those who helped build and finish the frames for the stained glass windows in the sanctuary. I know many other projects were completed around the church such as mowing, cleaning the grounds, spraying weeds, shoveling snow and on and on. A special thanks to the Executive Board for trusting me to manage all the projects, to Pastor Cynthia for her spiritual guidance, to Kathy for keeping me on track, reminding me what needs to be done, taking messages, making calls and helping me be more organized and to Leigh for the great job she does keeping track of all the accounts that property is involved in. In closing all I can say is THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU TO EVERYONE AT FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH.

COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY


