New Year's Traditions

Once upon a time, a church was having its annual all-church New Year's dinner. Even though the event was advertised as a "potluck" meal, everyone in the congregation knew that they were to sign up for specific dishes and then follow the recipes in the old church cookbook. An awkward bachelor who was new to the church volunteered to bring a "Big Bowl of Fruit" to the New Year's dinner. He looked over the list and decided he could certainly handle that. People at the church were so glad to have a new member coming to their New Year's event that they forgot to check whether or not he had a copy of the church cookbook, or knew the page number for the "Big Bowl of Fruit" recipe. It was a large salad that combined three types of canned fruit with chopped up fresh fruit, all covered with cream dressing. Well, young Mr. Bachelor just brought a big bowl of fruit - (one apple, one banana, one orange, a bunch of grapes, etc.) - though the "old guard" at the church was certainly surprised at his offering, the kids at the church loved it so much that it became the 'new' tradition!

Does your family have a New Year's tradition? My Mom used to make oyster stew on New Year's Eve. When I was little, my parents would pop popcorn after dinner and we'd all play board games and stay up late (even to 10:00). Kathy Winders tells me that her mother would sometimes serve pork or ham because a "pig roots forward" but you *never* serve poultry because turkeys and hens "scratch backwards," and you want to head *forwards* into the New Year. Some parts of the country see balck-eyed peas, lentils or beans as being "lucky" and so serve them on New Year's.

Depending on your perspective, following certain traditions can either be a source of comfort and deep meaning or feel like you're "stuck in a rut." On the one hand, a church that says, "We've never done it that way before," with dread and fear can limit its future and drive away new members. Yet, those same words, "We've never done that before!" can be spoken with awe, excitement and a willingness to try what's new. From my perspective, FCC Casper is a healthy congregation which does a pretty good job of both honoring key traditions and trying new things. At Christmas, we will have a beautiful candlelit service for Christmas Eve with traditional carols and communion, but we also have new ways of celebrating the season each year. Last year we hosted "A Night in Bethlehem" and this year we had a Christmas Recital, encouraging children & adults in the church to share their talents.

There will definitely be some new experiences ahead of us in 2019 as we move towards refining a job description and appoint a Search Committee to help call an Associate Pastor. We will keep using the "recipes" that work well - meaningful worship, strong community service, nurturing members of all ages - and we'll be trying some "new dishes" too. Please pray for ALL of the leaders of our congregation as we move into the New Year of 2019.

FCC FELLOWSHIP QUILTERS - THE "OTHER" BLANKET MINISTRY


Every Wednesday morning, a small group of dedicated church women meets in the Fellowship Hall in a ministry of quilting. When Bev Miller died, her family generously donated her projects and materials to the group with which we were able to make quilts for Rhys Elser and Natalie Grooms. We also finished two of her projects and donated one to Wyoming Oncology and the other as a graduation gift to a homeless high school student. Another project was finished and sold with the proceeds going to the purchase of much needed tools.

Working almost exclusively with donated fabrics, we were able to finish several other projects and raffled a quilt to the young people of the church last Christmas. We are finishing our second quilt to support Seton House and also finished a Quilt of Valor that was presented to Raylan Heck. Levi Ostrander received a quilt to welcome him to our church family. It was covered with brightly colored shoes.

Additionally, we were able to give a quilt to Virginia Yohn's daughter who lost her home and belongings in a fire; we sold a quilt that we had been working on for a very long time to Shirley Morton. We had planned to raffle it for the Week of Compassion, but it was the first quilt that Shirley had ever sewn so she purchased it and made a substantial donation to the Week of Compassion. Months later, that quilt was lovingly draped over her casket at Newcomers by her

family. We started an Irish Chain quilt that Wanda Leeling said was her favorite of all the quilts the group had ever done. It was finished and we presented it to her at Hospice the day before she died. We have another quilt that should be finished by the end of December and hope to sell raffle tickets for it shortly after that.

We have made 14 quilts in 18 months. A huge thank you to Annette Ambrosino and Kalico Kat Quilts for donating sewing machines! They work great, and we will be putting them to work keeping others warm.
