

Telling the Good News = Evangelism

Happy Easter! "Christ is Risen. Christ is Risen, Indeed." This traditional greeting has been shared at Easter by Christians for longer than anyone can exactly recall. It expresses the JOY of the resurrection as well as the HOPE shared by Christ's followers that we too will be raised to new life in Jesus Christ. The Eastern Orthodox Church

passes along a tradition that credits Mary Magdalene herself with popularizing this saying that has become known as the "Paschal Greeting." After all, she supposedly addressed Emperor Tiberius in Rome with the words "Christ is risen."

Perhaps more at Easter than any other time of the year, Christians are made bold to tell others the **good news** that we find in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. In Greek, the word εύαγγελιόν "euangélion" means Good News. It refers to the Gospel, the Good News of Jesus Christ. "Euangélion" is also the source of the word "evangelism." So - at the heart of the matter - an evangelist is one who tells or shares Good News.

What is GOOD for you about knowing Christ? What is good in *your* life because you believe in God? What goodness comes your way for being a part of the church? To engage in evangelism, it is helpful to reflect personally on how we might answer these questions. Do you have more peace or joy or hope in your heart because you're a Christian? Do you find strength in times of trial? Does spending time in prayer help center your life, guide your decisions or bring blessings of peace and courage? For me, having a church family means I'm not alone. When I face times of trial in life, I know that there are others I can lean on for strength. Whether it's the death of a loved one or a serious illness, I know that if I ask others to pray with and for me, and I *will* have more peace when they do.

I invite you to think *specifically* about why you're a member of First Christian Church. What is it about this congregation that enriches your life? Perhaps it's a small group you participate in, the joy of singing with others in worship, or insights into scripture you've gained here through the years. What about our church would be a blessing for others you know? Do you know someone who likes to help people? Someone who's eager to learn or who wants to serve? Someone who's lonely or struggling in life right now? Invite that person to come with you to worship or to serve beside you at the sandwich ministry or to visit your Sunday School class or women's group. Don't just tell them what time worship is, but offer to pick them up. Bring them on Easter Sunday and come early for the "share a snack" coffee fellowship time between services in Fellowship Hall. Personally introduce them to someone else at FCC.

Evangelism Tips for Members - Think about what's most important to YOU about your faith and about our church. Actually write down a list so that it will be easier to tell someone else when the opportunity arises. Pray for God to show you who you might invite to church. Send a card, make a phone call or stop by and visit that person.

Other suggestions - wear your name tag. It makes it easier for visitors to know who they can ask for directions or information. Sit in a different pew from time to time. It gives you a new perspective on worship as well as the chance to get to know different people before or after church. Come to coffee hour. Sit with someone you don't know well. Practice telling *your* faith story. Start with someone close to you or a friend from church. Say out loud three ways in which you are blessed to be a Christian. You can't expect to talk about your faith with someone who's never been to church if you're not even comfortable sharing that story with someone who already knows Jesus - so practice. Invite a friend from church to coffee and talk together about the top 3 things you love about God and the top 3 things you like about FCC. Easter IS a time to share the Good News! Let's each do our part.

Fair Trade Coffee - Why FCC uses "Equal Exchange" Coffee



Did you know that most multi-national coffee corporations regularly use purchasing practices that take advantage of growers in Latin America and Africa? Their primary focus is their own profit. Multiple "middle-men" are involved between the sites where coffee & cocoa beans are grown and the final point of sales – along the way, each of those brokers & shippers make larger profits than the farmers who work the soil. It's a common practice in countries like Honduras for large companies to clear-cut tropical forests, plant coffee in the sun (often depleting the soil) and then move on. That practice also requires multiple chemical fertilizers ... Fair Trade offers an alternative to these harmful practices.

Local farmers work in cooperatives to preserve natural fauna, opting for coffee varieties that thrive in the shade and can be managed well on smaller farms. The people who grow & pick the coffee beans receive a fair wage for their efforts, which is then invested in their own communities, supporting education for children, more self-determination and meaningful work for women, and preservation of the environment. It's interesting that something as simple as the decision about the type of coffee we serve on Sunday morning can be a form of ministry in itself. By supporting Equal Exchange – and by educating our members about the lives of coffee growers – we can make a difference in the world.




