

Throughout my years in ministry I have never ceased to be amazed by the things good church folk say. Once long ago, I waited with the with the sister of a church member while her brother was having heart surgery. We got to talking about "grudges" and "forgiveness". She said to me, "I only hold grudges for about 25 to

30 years and by then the person is usually dead so I don't really worry about it." I think my mouth hit the floor. And I have no idea what was said next. I was so completely shocked. She was serious. I was speechless!

Grudges have no place in the community of faith.

Forgiveness has a central place in the community of faith.

Many of us have trouble with this. We are more familiar with grudges than with forgiveness. And that is a hard thing to admit. Forgiveness does not come easy. There are many experts out there in cyberland to tell you about forgiveness, what it is, how to do it, why it's good for you. The Mayo Clinic, the American Psychological Association, John Hopkins University, TED talks, Stanford University and many, many religious organizations offer a plethora of information on the web.

My own incomplete and evolving opinion, required of no one, is this: To ask forgiveness and to offer forgiveness takes a very courageous heart because forgiveness is complicated. Scripture tells us and Jesus tells us to forgive as God has forgiven us. I know I am not quite able to do that at times. I keep trying though. I try not to hold grudges but letting a grudge go is....well, sometimes I like just being angry (mostly at my washing machine right now) and maybe I actually like being hurt (it can give me a sense of righteousness you know). But, then being angry and hurt just makes my insides a mess and I don't like that either. It's a tangled web. Then today, I discovered something new.

Colossians 3:35 reads: Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other, just as Christ has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. The word "forgive" here is based on the word "GRACE". It is to show grace, favor, kindness to another; to have a gracious attitude toward another. So, when I am angry and hurt the question (eventually) becomes, "How am I able to be gracious, kind to the one who has angered me, hurt me?" It will take time for me to get to the place where I can even ask the question. But with time, and some help from God, I'll get there. WE all will.

I feel it is very important for me to apologize to the congregation, for a recent action on my part. The Personnel Committee had a meeting and it appeared to me that I was not invited to attend. I now know that attempts were made to notify me of the date and time of the meetings by email.

The problem was with a "hacker" or computer error, not with the Personnel Committee. I am embarrassed by my response. Please forgive me. **Dan Coey**

FCC REOPENING

We are so happy to have the doors open for worship. We opened on Sunday, June 7th and have had good attendance at both services. HOWEVER, the congregation still needs to be aware that things will look different and be different and in compliance with the Governor's Orders, the Health Department and the CDC's rules so we can keep all of our members and guests safe.

1. We will be offering two (2) services each Sunday -- 8:15 and 10:10. NO RESERVATIONS ARE NEEDED.

2. How to enter the church.

You will enter the church either through the fellowship hall door or through the elevator door. A deacon will great you at the elevator to take you up to the main floor. **Hand sanitizer and masks will be made available.** If you have your own mask, we encourage you to wear it. If you do not need the elevator, we encourage you to use the Fellowship door.

3. Seating

A deacon will greet you and escort you to your seat. For social distancing reasons we will seat every other row with alternating rows on either side of the center aisle. You will be seated front to back. **FIRST SERVICE WILL SIT IN THE PEWS WITH THE GREEN DOTS. SECOND SERVICE WILL SIT IN THE PEWS WITH THE RED DOTS.** After the service the deacon will dismiss the congregation from the back of the church to the front. If you are seated towards the front, please just be patient and we will get you out as soon as possible. There will be NO coffee or social hours at this time so as soon as the service is over, we ask you leave the building as quickly as possible again either through the fellowship hall or by the elevator.

4. Communion

Since we are not able to pass the communion trays you will be given an individual communion packet containing a wafer and juice. Also since we are unable to pass the offering plate, we will have a unique way of collecting the offering during the offering time.

5. Notes about the service.

Hymns, scriptures and bible readings will be on the overhead screens up front. There will be no bulletins. Due to the social distancing guidelines we will not have a choir. If you have little ones, the busy bags have also been put away for now.

As a reminder please be safe, wear a mask and use the hand sanitizer. You have been missed and we look forward to seeing you in church. You're safety is our main priority. If you have any questions, contact the church office.

PRESCHOOL UPDATE

This fall we WILL be having preschool again. Preschool will open on Tuesday, September 8th with our big Open House and start regularly scheduled classes on September 9th & 10th. This year we will be celebrating **SUPERHEROES.** It has been a difficult time with ever changing rules and regulations. Our enrollment has been very slow, but we are beginning to get more phone calls everyday. We currently have 6 openings in our Pre-K class, 5 in the 3-4 class, 3 in the young 3's class and 3 in the intro class. I'm hoping to get a few more students in each class before the end of summer. If you know anyone of preschool age, let them know we have openings.

The preschool will be having a summer celebration picnic that will celebrate our pre-k kids who graduated. We will be having a picnic on the playground on August 13th at 6:00 p.m. I wasn't sure if families would want to come back to celebrate with us, but we have had an overwhelming response from them. We will have a short graduation ceremony and hand out diplomas. I'm so happy that our children and parents will have closure as preschool has played an important part of their lives over the past three years.

We have a big project that will hopefully happen in August in the preschool...We will be replacing the flooring in the three classrooms. From fundraising, donations, and some grant money we will have enough funds to replace them. We are looking for volunteers to help install the flooring. I'm told it is a simple install. Colin Hogan, Vice Chair of the FCC Board is working with us and says "it's easy enough for everyone to help." We do not have a date as of yet so watch for information. We are very excited!!
