BEAUTY.

They say it's in the eye of the beholder. But I think it comes from the eye of God and we find it with the eye of our soul.

When we speak of beauty all too often we speak of physical beauty. Mostly the culture speaks of women as "beautiful" or not; too often we allow culture to define "beauty" for women and we know that leads to disaster. That kind of "beauty" is not even, as they say, "skin deep." Then there's the whole "beauty products" industry we won't even discuss.

BEAUTY is some altogether different:

This last week while I was at home cleaning house (pitching out all those Costco boxes) I was reminded of that lovely hymn "For the Beauty of the Earth." I was watching WILD NORDIC on Disney+. One of the episodes was about the waterways in Scandinavia. There is a tradition called "WILD ICE SKATING." After the first cold snap, when the waterways have just frozen with a layer of thin black ice (only 2 inches thick) some brave skaters take to the ice. As they skate along the thin black ice a sound is heard. The sound is like a sonar or lasers at battle. The pitch of the sound changes as the ice thins. The sound is the *ice cracking behind the skater as the waves ripple through the water below the ice*. The scene of a lone skater moving along the black ice reflecting the sky filled with cumulous clouds looks like the skater is *gliding on clouds*. It is a sight and sound of beauty. I could only watch in silent awe.

Then I thought of the hymn and I knew its author, Folliott S. Pierpoint felt the same as he gazed upon the River Avon and the surrounding countryside not far from his home in Bath, England in 1864. Eight six line verses of the hymn we know as *For the Beauty of the Earth* were published that same year.

And then there is this...

Somehow, when Kathy Morrison was in the hospital last month, her glasses were lost. Kathy looked everywhere. George and Terri looked everywhere. The hospital staff looked everywhere. The glasses were nowhere to be found. Eyeglasses are an important thing. That goes without saying really. George got ahold of Kathy's prescription and took it to EyeMart. *We need a couple of pairs of this prescription please. We need to see the patient and check for changes and corrections. That's not possible. We must. But you can't. But still. My sister is in the hospital and going home soon on hospice care. Oh. We'll take care of it. Thank you.*

When George went back to EyeMart to pick up Kathy's new glasses the manager met him. *Here they are. Glad we could help. There's no charge.* George was surprised at their kindness. And he was most grateful.

I saw George a day or so after that in the hospital parking garage. We chatted about what an amazing thing it was for EyeMart to make Kathy's new glasses and not charge him at all. He said to me, "That sure is a thing of beauty." A thing of beauty. EyeMart's kindness is a thing of beauty. I hadn't thought of actions as *things of beauty* until I heard George's observation that day. I know we surely recognize actions of ugliness in the world. We recognize that very quickly. I wondered how quickly we recognize actions of beauty around us? Do our eyes behold the beauty of everyday life? I tried to figure out when the last time my actions might have been perceived as *a thing of beauty*. That's worth pondering. And that's worth attending to deeply, as is living a life of beauty.

Eyes that behold beauty. Ears that hear beauty. A hand whose touch is one of beauty. A tongue that speaks beauty (oh, I'll keep that discussion internal).

Lord of all to thee we raise, this our hymn of grateful praise.





Scholarship applications for the 2020 Fall term are available on the bulletin board outside the secretary's office. Deadline for applications is Monday, August 9th to the church office.


SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Maximum numbers of semesters will be 4 for an Associates Degree and 8 for a Bachelor's Degree. If major requires more than 120, students may petition Wills, Trusts, Memorial & Scholarships for consideration of an extension.
- Must be an active participating member of FCC Casper, WY.
