MOVING.. Last week I moved again. This time it was just across town from 21st street to 1st street downtown. Moving doesn't bring out the best in us---in me and John that is. This is our reality. We know it, we accept it AND we anticipate it. Over the last 36.5 years

John and I have moved 12 times. 12 times we have bubble wrapped, boxed and taped up our possessions, carried and packed them into a car or a U-haul and driven from one side of town to the other, one side of our country to the other and back again. Every time we move, we "loudly discuss" what must be kept, what needs to be tossed, how many books do we really need to take with us (all of them), we are not taking that beat up pre-school cubbie with us again (yes. we.are.). Yes, we need to cut the sofa bed out of the basement and trash it! Together, we loaded our 1984 Amana side-byside on to a truck from California to Nevada to Texas to Georgia to Kentucky. That refrigerator lasted through 7 moves and 20+ years. Oh! it was a sad day when our beautiful 1984 Amana had to go the way of non-energy efficient appliances.

Moving is a big project and it always take longer than we anticipate (we've missed a hotel reservation or two along the way---we didn't get off and away as soon as we wanted, we were too exhausted to travel as far as we intended). We get tired. We get testy with each other. Yet, underneath all our noise and frustration (and yes, anger and fear) we are deeply grateful for the other. We know we can depend on the other for presence, help, support. We know we are able to depend on the other to find the way forward when we cannot see the light of our new day (fear does that even in times of joy.) We are glad to not be alone. We know this. And still...

It seems to me life in the church is like that **MOVING**, from past to present to future doesn't always bring out the best in us here either. We get loud, we get quiet, we get testy and snippy with each other. It is difficult to figure out how much room there is in the moving truck. It's even more difficult to figure out what goes in the truck: what do we take with us as we move on to a new day? What do we need to leave behind and let go of? (or to say it another way, how much will fit in your bag? What's important? What are you willing to carry? What do you need to let go of and leave behind?). We get nervous and we are afraid because in the church that new place, that new day we are on our way to isn't always so clear. The new day, the new place of promise can be fuzzy to see or define. The destination can be uncertain. I understand why the Israelites wandered the wilderness for so long and why they wanted to go back to Egypt. Egypt was...known. There were too many unknown's on that promised side of the Jordan river.

But we are God's people. And God has promised to be with us--always. God may not pack our bags (those choices are ours) but God will continue leading our journey. God's people are always on the move to a new place, to a new day, to a new promise. We may not see it clearly. It may take longer than we thought. But we are not alone. God is with us AND we have each other. This we know. **Dr. Caryn Yoast**

<u>CHURCH PROTOCOL UPDATE</u> <u>REGARDING COVID-19 AS OF 1/18/21</u>

First Christian Church has been monitoring the COVID Pandemic and have been following the recommended precautions to limit the spread of the virus. We continue to limit church attendance at both services, require face masks, social distance people by alternating every other pew to sit in and provided hand sanitizer at various different locations throughout the church. We feel that these measures keep our congregation as safe as possible and still allow us to worship on a weekly basis.




COME TO THE BLANKET BLITZ!!!!
