# CHURCH PROTOCOL CHANGES REGARDING COVID-19 AS OF 12/07/20

With the continued increase in COVID-19 numbers for Natrona County and trying to keep our congregation safe, and our church open we are asking everyone to please follow the guidelines that were implemented. We DO NOT want to shut down again.

- I. All attendees will have their temperature taken before entering the sanctuary. There will be a greeter with a sign in sheet and will also take your temperature before entering.
- 2. EVERYONE is asked to use hand sanitizer before entering and upon leaving the sanctuary.
- 3 We ask everyone to please wear a mask or face covering. Masks and hand sanitizers are available. If you have your own face covering, we encourage you to wear it throughout the entire service, from entering the building to exiting the building.
- 4. **Seating** -capacity of 50 people. For social distancing reasons we will seat every other row with alternating rows on either side of the center aisle. You will be seated front to back. **FIRST SERVICE WILL SIT IN THE PEWS WITH THE GREEN DOTS. SECOND SERVICE WILL SIT IN THE PEWS WITH THE RED DOTS.** There will be NO coffee or social hours at this time so as soon as the service is over, we ask you leave the building as quickly as possible again either through the fellowship hall or by the elevator.
- 5. **Communion.and offering**..We are still using the individual prepackaged communion cups. Offering is still being collected with the butterfly nets.
- 6. Notes about the service. Scriptures and bible readings are still on the overhead screens up front. We have been fudging a little by only singing one verse of the hymns BUT will not have a choir until the regional office and other protocols we are following say it is permissible. SPECIAL MUSIC...Until we are able to have a choir, there is a sign up sheet on the bulletin board if you are interested in providing special music during second service.
- If you have little ones, the busy bags have also been put away for now. but the nursery is open if you are comfortable having your kids in the nursery. Children are welcome to sit with their parents too.

As a reminder please be safe, wear a mask and use the hand sanitizer. You have been missed and we look forward to seeing you in church. You're safety is our main priority. If you have any questions, contact the church office. *Thank you*
