If you've been around the church during the week recently, you may have seen me up to my eyeballs in trash. I've been cleaning house. Or as I've been telling folks, I've been "Marie Kondo-ing" church!

A few years ago my youngest daughter Hava sent me a book they started selling in her shop in Boston: *The Life-Changing Magic of Tidying Up* by Marie Kondo. Marie Kondo is an organizing expert with books and a Netflix series that teaches folks how to "transform their cluttered homes into spaces of serenity and inspiration." The major question we must ask of our clutter, Ms. Kondo tells us is, "does this item bring us joy?" If not, we must toss it. There's more to it but that's the take away for me. Anyway...

Hava thought I might like the book as it helped her AND she knew I despised clutter (even though I am constantly surrounded by it!). Well, I won't dwell on my relationship with clutter and my complete and utter lack of joy in folding T-shirts in the "Kondo way" but I will say this: I certainly find much joy and everlasting happiness in watching Marie Kondo find joy in folding T-shirts into little tiny rectangles that stand up quite nicely in a well organized dresser drawer.

We could all learn a little something from Ms. Kondo. Joy is good. Really good. It's one of those fruits of the spirit! And, churches, I will say it...are hoarders. We are. We bring the stuff we don't want in our homes anymore and bring it to church thinking, "Oh, this is still in pretty good shape. They can use it at church." Well here's the question, if you don't think its appropriate for your home anymore why is it appropriate for God's home now? Our buildings are clutters with things we don't want anymore, things that don't bring us joy anymore. Our buildings are cluttered with old books and curriculum and files that "maybe we will use this again. Maybe we will need this someday." And we do need some of that but mostly we don't.

So, with the calling of a new pastor it's time to clean house! It's time to take a good look at our building and toss out the things we don't need (like curriculum from 1970). And most importantly, we need to clean the house of our inner landscape, that is our heart. It's time to take a look around inside and see what old baggage we are dragging along with us: fear, sorrow, regret, narrow thinking, anger, old habits or routines, old ways of doing, of being... It's time to sweep out all that would keep you from becoming God's new creation because that is what is about to happen here.

God is at work transforming you into something new. A new life, a new heart and new spirit! And God needs room to work. So, beloved, lovely people of God, people of FCC Casper, the time is now. Get busy cleaning house. Something new and joyful is on the wind of the spirit.

Building a Better World, One House at a Time.

On July 14, 2021 the church will be offering hospitality to participants of the 14th annual Fuller Center Bicycle Adventure! There will be approximately 20-25 cyclists spending the night in Fellowship Hall. They are biking 3,750 miles from Amelia Island, FL to Florence, OR with the goal of raising \$600,000 to help fund the Fuller Center for Housing, a Christian non-profit 501 (c)(3) to end poverty housing worldwide.

They will be arriving in Casper on Wednesday, July 14, 2021 around 3:00 p.m. The DWM ladies will be providing dinner for the crew and our visitors. If you are interested in biking or their organization please join them for conversation in the Fellowship Hall. They like to spend time eating together with local members.

Peanut Butter/ Almond Butter
Jerky/Dried meat (without MSG)

Dry Nuts & seeds (salted w/sea salt, unsalted, roasted, or raw), peanuts, almonds, cashews etc.,

FATS

Olive Oil/Coconut Oil (plastic bottles) Butter (real, in tubs) String cheese or sliced cheeses

NUTRIENTS

Energy Gel Packets/Bottles/Blocks (GU, Hammer, Shot, etc.) Emergen -C packets (joint health to lubricate cyclists' working joints) Hummus & Fresh vegetables (celery, carrots, avocados etc.) Spinach (tubs or packages of fresh spinach)


MISSION COMMISSION UPDATE
