FAMILY CAMP

As part of our look at what our congregation has done over the past 100 years, we offer a quick look at an event the organizers called "Family Camp".

In the middle 1980s the organizers (four mothers and their families from the Home Builders class) wanted to create an activity that was all inclusive of all members of a family at the same time. The idea of a camp evolved through a serious planning effort. It was determined that in order to keep everyone engaged it needed to be a distance from Casper. In order to justify the drive time, it was concluded that the event needed to expand over a longer timeframe. A Saturday/Sunday format was developed and our good inter denominational friends made the Presbyterian Church Camp available to us outside of Story, Wyoming. Throughout the life of Family Camp, the event was structured around going to Camp on Saturday morning and coming hone Sunday afternoon. The Camp took on a life of its ow and expanded to offer a Friday evening start. The over riding premise was that it should be inter-generational and available to all. Our second church van even brought more campers up on Sunday morning. At times, the age span for the participants exceeded 75 years.

My memories of Camp are many and varied I remember the beginning arts and crafts activities as we all circulated through the many centers to open Camp each year. The free time in the afternoon is filled with BIG soap bubbles, hikes, fishing, babies sleeping on the porch of the dining hall while 15 older young kids played in the creek with abandon. I remember the talent show evoked such entertainment that people really do slap their legs and cry from laughing so hard. I still feel the warm embrace of God's love from 50 or more people singing and telling stories and young and old making smores at the campfire. The anticipation of Sunday morning service was overwhelming.

I also know that this reality would not have been possible without the love of our congregation and the commitment to that love from Kathy Badger and Anne Klocksiem. They prepared 4 to 5 weekend meals for 65 to 70 people at a time for 15 years and made it look effortless. They had it down to a science!

As I reflect on the life of Family Camp I find a refreshment of that original enthusiasm that created Family Camp in the first place. I know that any individual in our congregation is empowered to see a need and to respond. I am fortunate to have four generations of our family participating in First Christian Church. I so look forward to seeing how the Church serves my granddaughters and how my granddaughters serve the Church in the next generation. Can you imagine what the **next 100** years will look like?


VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL
