REMEMBER TO SPRING FORWARD SUNDAY, MARCH 14, 2021

"You could say that prayer without fasting is like boxing with one hand tied behind your back, and that fasting without prayer is, well, dieting" ----Matt Fradd This morning I was reading an Ash Wednesday devotional written by a recent graduate from my seminary. My first thought was "someone raised her well". She spoke about growing up in Sunday School and her class talking about what they were "giving up" during Lent. As kids, she and her friends joked about giving up "homework, school, and chores." Usually, they gave up

things were "bad" for them "junk food, soda pop, fast food" or thought they should give up things they "enjoyed". Self-deprivation was the real meaning of Lent don't you know.

Reading Psalm 51 in seminary she learned perhaps she and her friends and her well meaning Sunday School teachers didn't quite understand the meaning of a Lenten sacrifice. How, she began to wonder, would giving up soda pop relieve the burdens that weighed down upon her heart? It wouldn't. But she learned trying not to be so "overindulgent" or "short tempered with others" might.

Psalm 51 is traditionally read on Ash Wednesday. It is a penitential psalm that turns our attention to our "inward being," our deepest places where we find our truest selves, the image of God. Here is where we all find ourselves in need of a good bath---our bones, our spirits, our hearts. We have all become grimy, stained and sullied with wandering, wrongdoing, sin.

And yet, this is where our God meets us---Emmanuel meets us in the middle of our mess and our muck. Emmanuel meets us here in our murky inward being as we offer our broken places and spirits, our humble and contrite hearts as our sacrifice. Our Lenten sacrifice isn't soda pop or chocolate. It is those things that muddy our heart spirit.

This year, as a community you are invited to join our staff and our Board of Officers in taking up a Lenten sacrifice together. We are a community are not speaking well, not communicating well with each other these days. And so together our Lenten Sacrifice is this:

Before speaking to others, I will ask these 3 questions:

Is it kind? Is it true? Is it necessary?

This **pause** in our speech will change our inward being. It will bathe our spirits and hearts in wisdom from God. In taking up this Lenten sacrifice we may discover that what Greg Pennoyer says is true. Lent is the season we realize **God is** <u>FOR</u> us. He says, *"If Advent/Christmas is a revelation of God's presence with us, then Lent/Easter is a revelation of God's desire to use all of life for our wholeness and our healing---the revelation that God will pull life from death."*

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, ad sustain in me a generous spirit.

May it be so.

Here in our inward being we are met by our God and we plead for God's mercy! We know what we have become, what we have made of ourselves. We know our sin. We do not turn away from this. We ask our God to wash the grime away. We implore our God to cleanse us from stain. Teach us wisdom. Let us hear joy and gladness. Make our hearts clean and new! Recreate us! Make us steadfast, re-shape us into something new.

<u>CHURCH PROTOCOL UPDATE</u> <u>REGARDING COVID-19 AS OF 2/15/21</u>

First Christian Church continues to monitor the COVID Pandemic and have been following the recommended precautions to limit the spread of the virus. We continue to limit church attendance to 50 people at both services, require face masks, social distance people by alternating every other pew to sit in and provided hand sanitizer at various different locations throughout the church. We feel that these measures keep our congregation as safe as possible and still allow us to worship on a weekly basis.

Our preschool has done a remarkable job in cleaning and sanitizing the areas that the kids are in and we are one of the few preschools in town that has not had to shut a classroom down due to COVID exposure.

Our custodian continues to do a fantastic job in cleaning and sanitizing all areas in the church with special attention to the high touch areas. All of these measures help prevent the spread of COVID.

So where do we go from here? We are now beginning to work toward providing Sunday School for our children again. We currently have 2 adults Sunday School classes that meet at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday. Twice a month our CYF Sunday School (grades 6-12) meets during the 10:10 worship service. If you are interested in assisting us as we work toward providing a safe and comfortable learning environment for our children please let the church office know.

We will continue to check temperatures, ask people to continue to wear face masks, provide hand sanitizer, and continue to social distance as much as possible.

CENTENNIAL MINUTES MEMORY


February 13, 1934



PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION FOR 2021-2022 YEAR IS OPEN!!



EASTER EGG HUNT


We would really like to do an Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 3rd but COVID and weather will determine whether we can have one. Stay tuned!!
