CHURCH RE-OPENING FROM COVID-19

HISTORY.

Looking back at history can be a tricky proposition. As much as we would like to think otherwise, history is rarely objective fact telling. More often than not, it is storytelling with interpretations of the past being made by the storyteller. The storyteller may not be even be aware of their own interpretations spilling into stories of the past but there they are.

Consider the journey into our own past here at First Christian Church. We mark February 13, 1921 as the official founding of the church. To be sure, this is the date of a formal organization named First Christian Church here in Casper, Wyoming. But it is not the only one, nor is it the first—official organizing of First Christian Church in Casper, Wyoming that is.

The Sisterhood" was the first organized effort to birth the Christian Church in Casper. The minutes of that first meeting read: A number of ladies met at the home of Mrs. Hurtt January 13, 1915 for the purpose of organizing a society of some kind among the ladies of the Christian Church. Mrs. Hurtt acted as chairman, Mrs. W.A. Baker Sec. pro-tem. The meeting was opened by scripture reading after which Mrs. Trager led in prayer. The question was then before the house. What should we call our society. A motion was made to call it "The Sisterhood." Motion carried. The following officers were then elected—Mrs. Herman Johnson, President, Mrs. W.A. Baker, Vice President, Mrs. Harry Williams, Secretary & Treasurer. There were present Mrs. Johnson, Baker, Trager, Henderson, Hurtt and Williams. (Record Book #1, Sisterhood of the Christian Church, Casper, Wyo. January 13, 1915 - September 20, 1923, p 1.)

The Sisterhood got busy with the work of mission, ministry, fellowship here in Casper but that news didn't travel or so it would seem...In writing about the mission field of Wyoming, Sheridan Pastor Arthur J. Aikins wrote:

Casper could never have been reported [as having a Christian Church], for the simple reason that there never was any organization until last fall, when William I. Stahl began a meeting there in a tent and effected an organization. Cold weather came on which drove them from the tent and they practically quit. (Christian Standard, January 5, 1918)

Mr. Aikins obviously hadn't met The Sisterhood. Preacher Stahl was not the organizing force in Casper. The Sisterhood was and they had been organized for 3 years. And Preacher Stahl wasn't the one who *began a meeting there in a tent*. The Sisterhood did. They purchased a tent from the Ladies Aid of the Wheatland Christian Church at a price of \$40 (The Sisterhood minutes, September 5, 1917) for *our coming revival* at which Brother Stahl was invited to preach. Following the revival Brother Stahl and The Sisterhood would work together to organize a church on September 23rd at 9:00 pm (The Sisterhood minutes, September 17, 1917). And, perhaps most importantly, they did not *practically quit*. They ORGANIZED A CHURCH! Yes, cold weather came. Yes, they sold the tent—because they went inside! They found homes to meet in. They built a *Tabernacle* at Grant and 3rd streets. Our own written history picks up the story here,

Services were held for only a short time. During the first World War the congregation disbanded and the property was sold. However, this group of women continued their meetings. "So, for six or seven years, this faithful group labored on alone, and like the five wise virgins kept their lamps trimmed and well supplied with oil, that the bridegroom's coming might not find them unprepared." (Gadbery) "There's not a life, or a death or birth / That has a feather's weight of worth / Without a woman in it."

Let us thank God today for their example of Christian commitment and determination. First Christian Church has served 50 years because these people lost a battle, but persevered in their faith. (Lewellyn p 9)

Now, having read through the record books of The Sisterhood I believe there to be more than a little "storyteller's interpretation" in our written history even as I admit my own. The Sisterhood didn't *labor on alone*. They have never been alone. God's presence is seen throughout their written pages as together they moved through pandemic and war and letting go of tabernacles they built with their own hands and changing landscapes of culture and mission and ministry. Across the years, decades, century, the women of the Christian Church in Casper have never *lost* anything! and they certainly have not *lost a battle* because they have never been at war with anyone. These faithful women have always been about the work of mission and ministry. They are, as they have always been, disciples!

You know, the latest meeting of *The Sisterhood*, now called *Disciples Women's Ministry*, happened just a couple of weeks ago when DWM Group #1 met on April 8th 2021. The minutes of every Sisterhood, CWA, CWF, DWM meeting are here along with their names, their work, their studies, their commitment to the on-going mission and ministry of the Christian Church here in Casper Wyoming. It is all here. Written. Recorded.

It's been over 100 years. Maybe it's time to write HER-STORY. Maybe it's time to finally claim HER-STORY as the founding story, the birth story of First Christian Church of Casper.

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS NOVEMBER 10, 1926

Meeting called to order by Vice Chairman Hoon. Prayer by Brother Gadberry. Minutes of last meeting read and approved. Roll call showed the following present: ELDERS Hoon, Gadberry, Johnson and Gay; DEACONS Hemry; DEACONESSES Hoon and Johnson. Treasurer's report read

and accepted.

- Motion made and carried to allow bill for pianist during revival meetings.
- Motion made and carried that we deem it not best to give up morning services to anti-saloon league on December 12, 1926.

Elder Park now present. Deacon Reed now present.

 Motion made and carried that Mr. Gadberry and Mr. Hemry be authorized to borrow money to pay interest on mortgage.

Meeting adjourned. *C.D. Hemry, Secretary*

The 18th amendment was in effect at the time of this meeting. Repealed by the 21st amendment in 1933.
