


THE CALL

Dear Church Family,

This has been a very exciting time in our church: We hired Rhonda Padilla who has started in her Associate Minister position. In the coming months

Rhonda will take on more ministerial activities. She is working on music in worship right now, soon she will be serving at the table and doing our Prayers - Concerns and Joys. The next activity will be her visiting parishioners (goal is 2-3 a week) and then take over doing the Children's Moment from time to time. It is great having her here and we are blessed.

The other exciting thing in the life of our church is that our "Faith Promise with a Purpose "Let the Light Shine - Restoring our stained glass for generations to come!" has been a great success. As of this writing we have over \$53,000 pledged and over \$35,000 received (that is 75% of our original goal!!). That is great. Sometime the end of Summer or beginning of Fall the educational wing window will be replaced and the upper portion of the sanctuary window will be taken out and fixed. The sanctuary window will be put back in sometime in the Spring of 2026.

As you all know we have had many visitors in the past couple of months. Many have visited and some have joined the church. Our finances seem to be as solid as our attendance. This is the highest average attendance summer since I came to FCC just about 4 years ago. I anticipate that the subtle changes that we will be making to enhance our worship experience in the coming months will help grow our church even more. Please remember to invite people to attend and to greet those who look new to our church. The feedback that I have received from visitors who have been looking for a church is that FCC is the first church they have visited where people actually talk with them and want to get to know them. Thanks for using your gift of hospitality as a church!

Our worship outdoors took place at Ayer's Natural Bridge and had great attendance. It was a great celebration. Fun was had by all - and yes it was a bit warm! This place is wonderful and it is some of God's best creative work!

I am leading our regions "Theology and Fishing" this year in the Big Horns on August 11 - 15th. John Hull will be our "theologian" and our Regional Minister Dale Matherly, along with about 8-10 participants will be there as well.

Many thanks to the generous members of our congregation for your support of the mission projects of our church. The 5th Sunday mission emphasis on June 29 was "Babies' Bottoms". We received generous donations of diapers and baby wipes to help families who may struggle with the cost of these items. Our donations were delivered to St. Mark's Episcopal Church in a joint effort to support their Heat to Hands ministry, from which parents can receive necessary baby care supplies that are often difficult to afford.

Our next 5th Sunday is August 31. Our goal is to collect various items for Shepherd of the Valley Nursing Center. Jane Perez and Martha Wallace are faithful volunteers there. Stay tuned for specific ways you can help.

On July 9, our church hosted the Fuller Center Bike Adventure, a group of bicyclers who were riding cross-country from Florida to Oregon to raise awareness of their organization and work. Founded in 2005, "The Fuller Center for Housing is a non-profit ecumenical Christian housing ministry dedicated to eliminating poverty housing worldwide. By forming partnerships with local organizations The Fuller Center provides structure, guidance, and support that communities need to build and repair homes for the impoverished among them". The bicyclers take days off from cycling to work alongside homeowners to improve their living situations."The Fuller Center home is not a handout, but a hand up, allowing homeowners to retain a sense of basic human dignity." The Mission Commission arranged for showers at the Rescue Mission, served supper and provided breakfast items and food and drink supplies for the next days of their journey. THANK YOU to everyone that helped with the supper and provided food.

We are honored to have Floyd as a member of this church, this community and this nation. We are all better for his service.






