Our 5th Sunday Mission Emphasis for November 30 is the school lunch debt at our three high schools. There is significant need to help students pay for their school lunches. This year there are 350 students at NCHS (some carry-over from Dean Morgan JHS), 172 students at KWHS, and 72 students at Roosevelt who have been unable to pay for their school lunches. This has resulted in an average school lunch debt of \$22.00, which builds up and follows these students through high school and may have consequences at graduation. Please join the Mission Commission and DWM in this special mission emphasis to help these students. The money we donate will go directly to Food Services at the three high schools. Please make checks to FCC, designate school lunch debt and a specific school if you wish, or place cash donations in an envelope and mark school lunch debt. Thank you for your care and concern for our students and for your generous contributions to this specific need.

Given the added burden created by the recent government shut-down, we have increased the number of lunches we make for the Sandwich Ministry from 80 to 85. When these lunches are distributed every Saturday from the Methodist Church downtown, we see the gratitude in the faces of the recipients and hear their words of thankful blessing. Indeed, we who make and distribute the lunches feel blessed that we can help individuals and families who face food insecurity. Join us in this blessed work. Contact Nancy Thomas (2025 Mission Chair) or Carla Schanck (2026 Mission Chair) and we'll set you up to make sandwiches on Fridays at 1:00, pack lunches Saturdays at 8:00, or distribute lunches on Saturdays from 10-12.

First Christian serves the evening meal at the Wyoming Rescue Mission every 4th Friday from 4:30-6:30. Contact Nancy or Carla to be scheduled for this amazing ministry.
