Dear Church Family,

Can you believe Christmas was just six weeks ago? Somehow, here we are already moving quickly through the new year—and the church calendar isn't slowing down either! Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18, and before we know it, Easter will be right around the corner. Time really does fly.

On Ash Wednesday, I will be in the sanctuary from 7:30–9:30 a.m. for anyone who would like to stop in for a brief devotion, prayer, and the receiving of ashes (if you choose). Whether you come before work, after school drop-off, or simply because you need a quiet moment with God, we would love to see you.

Lent is a meaningful season—a 40-day journey that invites us to slow down, reflect, and prepare our hearts. We remember Jesus' time in the wilderness, when he prayed, faced temptation, and prepared for the ministry God was calling him into. This season invites us into that same spirit of prayer, sacrifice, and renewed focus on sharing Christ's love in our daily lives. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of that journey—a time to realign our hearts with the heart of Jesus. To help you on your journey, we have developed an in-house Lenten devotional similar to our Advent devotional and should be available Sunday, February 15th.

We'll also be gathering for Lenten Soup & Devotions, led by our Elders, beginning Wednesday, February 25 at 6:00 p.m. and continuing through March 25. These evenings will include a short devotion, followed by a simple meal of soup, bread, dessert—and plenty of good fellowship. It's a wonderful midweek pause to reconnect with God and with one another.

I hope you'll find ways to participate in these opportunities and others as we continue living into life together as the Body of Christ. Be sure to check the church calendar for ways you can serve, grow, and share your gifts.

Winter won't last forever—even in Casper. Easter is coming, and with it the promise of new life. You can almost feel it already, quietly stirring hope in our hearts.

It is a joy-filled memory for the books to have been here with you through Christmas and as we rang in the New Year together. We have connected in so many meaningful ways, and I am deeply grateful. The changes in our sanctuary have blessed us beyond measure, and our congregation has been richly gifted through music during this season.

We are blessed by the musical gifts among us: Ruby Jennings has graciously agreed to play piano for us once a month; the Maddox family is also willing to bless us monthly; and Kathy has agreed to serve the church with her many gifts as well. On Christmas Eve, we were surrounded by the beauty of shared talent as Michelle Elser sang for us, Peggy Kumm (who sang with me and played the flute), Asher and Alex Rislov (guitar and piano), Caleb Wood (guitar), Collin Stewart (who played for us in November), along with our choir and bell choir, all stepped forward to share their gifts.

We will continue to allow God to shape our worship, and we are currently in discussion with a potential pianist/accompanist who may begin in May—more information will be coming soon. If you are interested in joining the choir or bell choir, I am planning a worship retreat in March to support vocal growth, bell techniques, and to prepare music for Easter. As soon as we have a confirmed date, I will share more.

I would also like to ask a small favor. Please consider stopping by the sound booth to thank Rick and Dennis for the hard work they do each week. We all strive to make worship a meaningful experience, and while sometimes everything flows smoothly and other times it does not, there are many moving parts behind the scenes. They genuinely do their best for us, and it is often a thankless role.

If you have comments or concerns regarding sound, cameras, or related matters, please write them down clearly and drop them off at the office for Kathy. If you choose to comment, please do so in love, include your name, and provide details such as which service you attended and where you were seated—especially if volume is the concern. This helps us address issues thoughtfully and effectively. I promise, I don't bite.

As 2026 continues, so does our transitional journey. Our Regional Minister, Dale Matherly, will be joining us this month for *The Visioning Summit* on February 21–23. I will also be attending my first Mid-Winter Retreat with our youth in the Central Rocky Mountain Region, and I look forward to all the “firsts” I continue to experience here with you. It has been a blessing to witness our growth, to welcome new members, and to see how powerfully people are drawn to the love we share as one body in Christ. Thank you for being the light of Christ’s love.

Speaking of love, February often greets us with reminders—cards, conversations, and small gestures that say, “You matter.” As people of faith, we know love is more than a season or a gesture. Love is an action word. It is the very heartbeat of God, poured out to us in grace and lived out among us in community.

Whether it is worshiping together, checking in on a neighbor, joining a small group, or offering a helping hand, every act of connection becomes a living expression of God’s love. As we move through February, may we practice love intentionally, notice and receive God’s grace with gratitude, and engage our community faithfully.

Let us be a people who show up for one another—honest about our need for God, hopeful about what God is still doing, and confident that love will always lead us forward.

Thank you for putting your trust in me! I am praying that this will be an exciting, eventful, and fulfilling year!


Knowing that I have surrounded myself with the best congregation that one could hope for, I know that it will be!

Mission Opportunities






